Dear Mrs. Taylor:
Safeway Stores in Portland retail milk at a gross profit of 2¢ per quart. This is a fair margin for retailing milk. Safeway, through its Lucerne Milk Company, also processes its own Lucerne brand which is sold through Safeway Stores in the Portland market. For years, Safeway and Lucerne representatives have appeared at Portland hearings called by the milk controller under the existing milk control law. Our representatives have presented figures regarding the costs and profits for the Lucerne plant operation and delivery to stores. The figures presented for the official record have consistently shown that the minimum wholesale prices fixed by the milk controller were too high and resulted in excessive profits per quart for our Lucerne operation. For the four weeks ended August 9, 1952, Lucerne made a wholesale profit of 2¢ per quart. An adequate profit would have been 1/2¢ per quart. Thus, the fixing of minimum wholesale and retail prices by the milk controller prohibited us from selling milk during that period for 1-1/2¢ per quart less than the 2¢ per quart which prevailed in Portland. It was and is illegal to sell for less. Lucerne, several years ago, increased the richness of Lucerne milk to 3.8% butterfat. The milk controller then placed strict restrictions in effect which limited richness of milk. Thus, Safeway-Lucerne has been unable to cut down its excessive wholesale profits either by reducing prices or increasing quality. To correct the evils in and arising from the present milk control law, your organization is sponsoring a new fair milk bill. This bill conforms with our long-standing published policies regarding milk. We are attaching excerpts of these policies. Sometime ago, we informed you that if you decided to sponsor a fair milk bill, we would be glad to support your efforts. We herewith enclose our check for \$45,000 as a contribution to your expense for advertising and other efforts to inform the voters of Oregon about the fair milk bill which your organization is sponsoring. This contribution is one means by which we can put excessive wholesale milk profits to a beneficial use for the consumers of Oregon. Enactment of the bill by yes vote on #332, next November 4, will enable us to make richer Lucerne milk available to more consumers at prices which will reflect modern methods and economies in distributing milk cash-and-carry through grocery stores.
