Truman Slates Whistle-Stop

NEW YORK (AP)—President Truman's whistle-stop tour in New York in behalf of Democratic candidate Adlai E. Stevenson will take him through the heart of the Empire State in a two-day, 12-speech trip.

Details of the president's New York visit Oct. 9-10 were announced today by Peter Croity, campaign director of the Democratic State Committee.

Truman's schedule calls for speeches and appearances from the rear platform of his special train in key cities from Buffalo to New York. A major address is scheduled at a rally in Buffalo.

The GOP running mate of Dwight D. Eisenhower drew warm applause last night in his kickoff speech at Pomona, Calif., near his hometown of Whittier.

The California senator's special train will carry him through California's farm-rich interior, Oregon and Washington during the next week. He flies to Reno, Nev., from Sacramento tonight for a speech, then heads up the Sacramento Valley and into Southern Oregon tomorrow.

Police estimated 7,500 to 10,000 heard his train-side attack against the Democratic administration and his promise that Eisenhower's election would "restore American integrity."

He was introduced briefly by Gov. Earl Warren.

The 39-year-old GOP vice-presidential nominee said the aim of the Republican ticket is to clean out what he called the "scandal-a-day Truman administration." He described the Democratic presidential nominee, Gov. Adlai E. Stevenson of Illinois, as "the handcuffed, handpicked captive of the Truman administration" and he said "a vote for Stevenson is a vote for Truman."

CAMPOR PRODUCTION PLAN
TOKYO (AP)—Japan soon will start mass production of synthetic camphor from natural resin under a recently discovered process. Kyodo News Agency said the method has been developed without depending on any U.S. or German patents. Turpentine oil is extracted from resin and then processed into camphor.
