ICC Approves Expansion

WASHINGTON (AP) — An Interstate Commerce Commission examiner recommended to the commission Friday that it authorize Inland Navigation Co. to extend its barge operations in the Northwest. Examiner Otto A. Hanson recommended extensions to: 1. Include Snake River below and including Lewiston, Ida. 2. Include the Columbia River below and including Priest Rapids, Wash., to Pasco, Wash. Hanson recommended denial of Inland's application to include service to or from Beaver, Ore. Tidewater - Shaver Barge Lines, Biddewater and Holt, Inc. and Columbia Basin River Operators opposed the applications.

Adlai Backers Pledge Win in Rebellious Texas Area

BONHAM, Tex. (AP) — Texas Democrats who want Adlai Stevenson for President of the United States had a pledge Friday from Speaker Sam Rayburn that every county in the state would be organized for a November victory. As Rayburn made his pledge Thursday for an all-out Democratic drive, former Atty. Gen. William McCraw at Dallas denounced two Democrats who say they won't support Stevenson. 1. Price Daniel, attorney general and nominee of both Democrats and Republicans for U.S. Senate, said he would introduce a bill in the Senate to press apart from other states Texas' claim to offshore lands. 2. Dr. Louis Buck of New Braunfels, Tex., chairman of the Young Republican Federation of Texas, said Sen. Richard Nixon, GOP vice presidential nominee, would arrive in Amarillo for a speech Sept. 26 at 6 p.m. McCraw referred to Gov. Allan Shivers and Daniel as "our presently bewildered and befuddled public officials." Rayburn's appointment to head the national Democratic nominee campaign in politically turbulent Texas was announced by Stephen Mitchell, chairman of the Democratic National Committee in Washington. "I think we're going to carry Texas and elect Adlai Stevenson President. We will set up organizations in every county of the state." The speaker's staunch party stand is at odds with the stand taken by Shivers and Daniel who have announced they cannot support the Illinois governor for President because he advocates federal ownership of the tidelands.
