Jarvinen Defense Asks Lattimore Be Subpoenaed

SEATTLE, Sept. 18.—Defense attorneys for John Lattimore, charged with espionage, asked the court today to subpoena the opening session of Harry A. Jarvinen's "false tip" trial in Federal District Court here Thursday.

A Federal Bureau of Investigation agent's testimony concerning knowledge of the activities of Lattimore, John Hopkins University professor and Far Eastern expert, brought the demand from Gerald Schucklin, Jarvinen's attorney.

Jarvinen, 32-year-old travel agency executive, is accused of falsely telling the FBI and the Central Intelligence Agency that Lattimore bought tickets here for a trip to

Russia last June.

As a result of the tip, the State Department barred Lattimore from leaving the country. The department later lifted the ban and publicly apologized to Lattimore.

Schucklin insisted that the John Hopkins professor be brought here to testify when FBI agent Stan Carter, the government's first witness, was on the stand.

Under questioning by Joseph A. Lowther, special justice department attorney, Carter said he was assigned to question Jarvinen June 13 and knew at the time Lattimore had no valid passport.

Later he said he knew Lattimore had not made arrangements for a leave of absence from John Hopkins University.

Schucklin then demanded that Lattimore be subpoenaed saying the professor was the only person qualified to make such statements.

Judge William Lindberg ruled, however, that Carter could continue.

Manuel Zinty, assistant reservation manager for the North American and Caribbean Division of Air France, followed Carter to the stand. He testified there was nothing in his files to show Lattimore had planned a trip to Russia via Air France in June. Other witnesses gave similar testimony.

In his opening statement Thursday, Lowther said the government would prove Jarvinen knew he was giving false information to a government agent.

Jarvinen has pleaded innocent to the charge, which carries a possible penalty of five years in prison and \$10,000 fine.

A jury of five men and seven women is hearing the case.

Besides the widow, Mrs. May R. O'Keefe, he is survived by: daughters, Joan O'Keefe, Bend, Mrs. Bert Schroder, Burns, Mrs. Clinton Bascy, Klamath Falls; a brother in Ireland, three sisters and three grandchildren.

SEWING MACHINE SERVICE AND EXCHANGE
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U.S. Building Base Near Pole

THULE, Greenland (AP)—The United States is building a huge strategic air base in the high Arctic wastelands of Greenland, less than 1,000 miles from the North Pole and on the polar air routes long-range bombers would use in any future war.

U. S. officials took many of the security wraps off this fantastic project Thursday for a group of U. S. and Danish reporters. Some jet intercepter planes already are using the still unfinished airfield on the northwest corner of Danish-owned Greenland.

From this base, thousands of miles nearer North Europe and Asia than any mainland American base, the U. S. could mount atomic counterattacks on a future enemy that might move against her.

Thule Air Force Base and its installations have been built up in the past 18 months on one of the few sizeable flat areas on Greenland's rocky West Coast.

The 90,000-acre project is set in a wide amphitheater, walled at the back by the island's perpetual ice cap. At the front a fjord runs down to iceberg-cramped Baffin Bay.

Beating the problems of polar cold and flint-hard ground, constructors have laid miles of paving for runways and have built hangars, machine shops and housing. A 1,200-foot radio tower keeps the base in touch with other links in the chain of U. S. defenses.

Officials estimate the base will cost 263 million dollars when completed. Col. Robert W. Humphreys, Thule commander, said 85 millions have been appropriated thus far. Of this, 165 millions will have been spent by the end of the current construction year.

Truman Disputes Ike Story

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Truman Thursday directly disputed Gen. Eisenhower's story of refusing to take command when the Army was taking over the railroads in 1946.

Truman told a news conference he was sure the chief of staff of the United States Army would not tell the commander-in-chief he would not obey an order.

And, Truman declared, so far as he was concerned there were no such conversations as Eisenhower related in a speech to the American Federation of Labor in New York City Wednesday.

Eisenhower said he was in Georgia when the government took over the railroads and Truman proposed that Congress give him power to draft strikers.

He said he got a telephone call from Washington —

"The message directed that I return to Washington immediately to assume command of the railway strikers, who were going to be drafted into the Army. With a bitter protest I refused."

"In a later call I was told that I was considered the only soldier

with whom the railway workers would even talk. So I agreed to meet with them. But I was a soldier and not a strike breaker."

During Truman's discussion of Eisenhower's statements, a press assistant suggested the President might add that he would not know if somebody else could have talked

with the general. The President said that no such conversation took place as far as he was concerned.

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Oregon Cons Write Songs

SALEM, Ore. (AP)—Two Oregon State prison inmates made such a hit with a couple of songs they wrote for a prison show last winter that now they're in business, from the inside, too.

They've picked up some financial backing, the approval of Warden Virgil O'Malley and have turned out a half dozen new songs.

When last winter's show, written, staged and acted by convicts—turned up a profit of \$7,400 for the Heart Fund, the two men who got the biggest critical praise were Seth Schwartz, 33, and Bob Nealey, 46.

Their songs "It's No Dream" and "Too Many Clouds in the Sky" had brought down the house.

The warden approved when they said they wanted to go into the music business and got backing from outsiders they won't name.

It's visitors' day that brings their inspiration, they say.

"A little old lady with a tear in her eye as she was talking to her son," said Schwartz, led to a song called "A Lady From a Very Small Town."

They are turning out records, on tape with the prison orchestra. The tape is sent out to a record manufacturer. They've arranged, too, for sheet music publication.

Schwartz, serving his third term for check forgery, has completed four years of his current 20-year term. Nealey is on his eighth term, this one for life on an assault-with-intent-to-kill conviction.

Heart Attacks Claim Three

BLUFF CITY, Tenn. (AP)—Two sisters died here of heart attacks after death claimed a third member of the family.

Loyal Jenkins, 57, died Tuesday of a heart attack. Thursday night, one of his sisters, Mrs. Etta Dungan, 53, of Savannah, Ga., died after viewing the brother's body.

Thirty minutes later, another sister, Miss Mae Jenkins, 61, of Bluff City, fell dead near her brother's casket.

Doctors said all deaths were the result of heart attacks.
