Ireland Bans Day Record; Opposed To 'Stage Irish'

HOLLYWOOD — This I wouldn't have believed if it hadn't come straight from that Irish tenor himself.

Dennis Day, just back from a visit to Ireland, discloses that the Irish have banned his RCA recording of "The St. Patrick's Day Parade."

Day, probably the most exemplary Irishman in Hollywood, is the son of Patrick and Mary McNulty, both of whom were born in Erin. He has been married to but one wife. She has borne him sons by the name of Patrick, Eugene, Dennis Jr. and Michael, and another baby is expected in a few months. They were married in 1948. And what's more, his first singing was done in the choir of St. Patrick's Cathedral in his native New York.

So, you can see, the news of his record banning came as quite a shock.

"The Irish didn't object to the song or to my singing," explained Dennis. "But they did object to my talking in it."

During the recording, he shouts, as if marching in the parade, to bystanders. His greetings, like "How are you Paddy, me boy?" are what the Irish objected to.

"They said they sounded like stage Irish," said Dennis, who indicated that he agreed with them. I asked him if he tried any of his brogue imitations in Ireland.

"No," he replied. "But I used my Jewish dialect one night."

He said he met a friend from New York by the name of Cohen, a textile expert, who is helping the Irish government in its woolen industry. Cohen took Dennis up to meet a group of his Jewish friends, all of them residents of Dublin.

"It seemed so funny to see these people with names like Levine, Goldberg and Cohen talking with Irish brogues that I broke out all of my Jewish dialect jokes. Then they all started laughing at me."

"I talked a little Yiddish with them all and they really howled."

Dennis gave a concert in his mother's home town in County Mayo and then attended an Irish Fair, where he bought a pig. Some 18 years ago, he had visited the village as a boy and had sold a donkey at the fair. The Irish custom in such a sale is to buy the buyer a drink. Dennis, being an American and too young at the time, didn't comply with the custom. The fellow reminded him of it when he returned 18 years later.

"I wound up buying him quite a few this time," says Dennis.

Dennis has made a fortune out of playing a dim-witted stooge for Jack Benny but he is far from dim-witted. He is rated one of the shrewdest businessmen in the game. He still is a Benny mainstay on radio and television. On Oct. 3, he starts his own 39-week series of coast-to-coast television for the Radio Corporation of America, the same outfit which sells his records.

Roderique is survived by his wife, Elizabeth, Lakeview; one son, Benjamin H. Roderique Jr., who is with the Air Force in Germany; by a daughter, Rose Marie Bonarick, McCredie, Mo.; two brothers, George Roderique, DeSoto, Mo., and Otis Roderique, Leasburg, Mo.; one sister, Mrs. Carl Eddy, Montana; and three grandchildren.

Roderique had been a resident of Oregon four years and a Lakeview resident one year.

Lakeview Street Repair Started

LAKEVIEW—The seal-coating of Lakeview's streets was started Wednesday morning by the contractor, Asphalt Paving Company, Klamath Falls. Town Supervisor Walt Dykeman said the contractor told him it would take about 3½ days to complete the work.

The patching job on the new paving was completed several weeks ago. The contract also called for the seal-coating.

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Fewer Banks, More Money in Several Western States

WASHINGTON — The number of banks has declined greatly in several Western states the last 20 years.

But within the same period, total bank deposits in 11 Pacific Coast and Rocky Mountain states

have increased from less than four billion to more than 23 billion dollars.

The figures were in a report released by the staff of a House judiciary subcommittee that made a study of bank mergers and concentration of banking facilities in the United States.

All the Western states recorded large gains in bank deposits between June 30, 1931, and Dec. 31, 1951, but California alone contributed about 13 billion dollars of the over-all increase.

This is how bank deposits compared in 1931, the high year in number of banks, and 1951. The 1931 figure is first, the 1951 figure second.

Idaho: 216 million — 476 million; Washington: 346 million — \$2,309,000,000; Oregon: 223 million — \$1,614,000,000.

But while deposits went up, the number of banks — including branch banks — went down, the report said.

In 1950 there were 86 per cent fewer banking offices in Idaho than in 1931, Washington 35 per cent fewer, and Oregon 38 per cent fewer.

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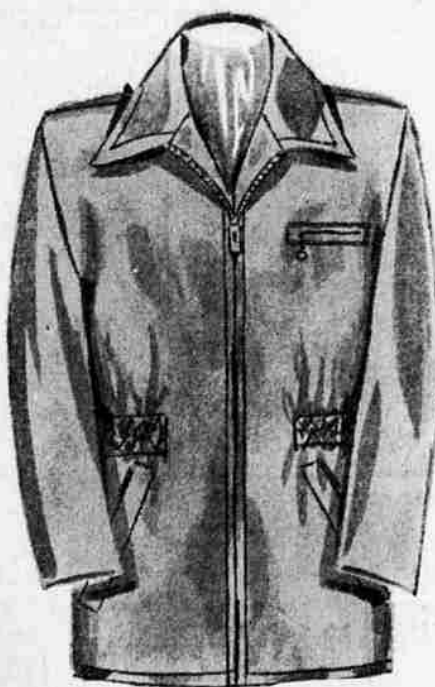
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A responsible consulting organization has reported the results of a continuing study by a competent medical specialist and his staff on the effects of smoking Chesterfield cigarettes.
