

Design For Friendship Camp Fire Girl Theme

"Design for Friendship" is the theme which Camp Fire Girls have chosen for the Grand Council Fire to be held this week at the Alamosa Junior High School, Wednesday evening starting at 7:30 p.m.

The Grand Council Fire is an annual event for Camp Fire Girls, Blue Birds, and leaders and parents. National honors and ranks will be presented to some fifty girls from Klamath Falls, Fort Klamath, Chiloquin, Merrill, and Dorris, Calif. This year it is timed as a kick-off for Camp Fire's fall membership drive which will continue until November 30.

During the membership campaign Camp Fire will attempt to make the program available to every girl in the county and, a special effort will be made during

this time to recruit and train enough leaders to meet the program needs.

The "Design for Friendship" will lead itself to a pageant presented in pantomime using seven girls from Chiloquin who will appear in costume to represent six faces of people. Each will add her tag to the "fire of human kindness which is the love of man for man and the love of man for God."

Mrs. George Proctor will award all of the ranks and Mrs. Lawrence (Naomi) French, executive director, will award the National honors. The roll-call will be by groups presented by Dolores Kidder, a torch bearer. Mrs. Bruce Wirth is chairman of the council fire arrangements and will preside during the program.

The public is cordially invited to attend. People attending should bring blankets to sit upon as the program will be held out-of-doors. The local Community Chest makes possible this Camp Fire Girls program for all girls in Klamath County.

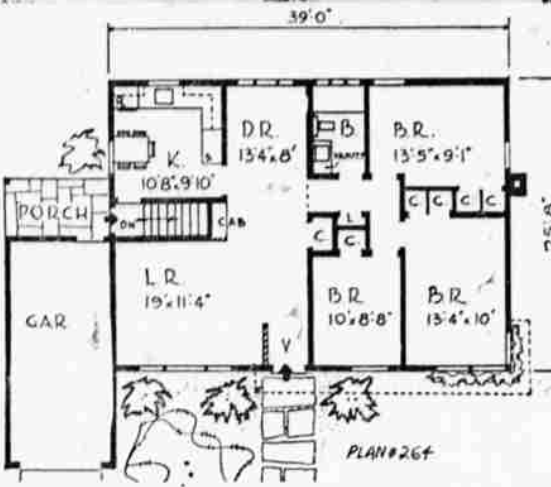
Perkins Death Reported Here

Custer Age Confirmed

Relatives of the late William Jasper Custer, Bonanza, who died Sept. 19 at Hillside Hospital, today verified his age as 104 years. Previous news source gave his age as 94.

Custer was born June 24, 1848 in San Antonio, Texas and was reported to have been a member of the Texas Rangers in his early life. He was married in 1885 at the age of 37 years and Mrs. Custer died at their home in Los Angeles in 1930. In 1932 he came to Klamath Falls. He also farmed for many years in El Centro, Calif. Until 1945 he made his home at Sorague River with a daughter, Mrs. Helen Poole who died in that year.

He was at the home of a granddaughter, Mrs. Dennis Smith, on the Lakeview highway when stricken with his last illness. Records of his birth and marriage are registered in the Mormon Temple at Salt Lake City.

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Police Take Escaped Con

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Edward Griffith, who escaped from a Washington State Prison work crew last month while serving a life term for the 1934 killing of a Seattle policeman, was arrested here early Monday.

Officers quoted the 38-year-old escapee as saying, when picked up:

"I'm a dead duck. When you kill a cop you're through."

Griffith made a getaway from the prison farm at Walla Walla last month.

Los Angeles County officers said he was arrested at a downtown hotel on a tip from a former cellmate at whose home he had sought shelter.

The tipster, unidentified by officers, said Griffith called on him Sunday in a Los Angeles suburb, said he was a fugitive and asked shelter for the night. The cellmate said he had no room and Griffith went to a hotel.

Former KF Man Visits

Arthur S. Bremer, long-time employee of the old Klamath Herald was in Klamath Falls last week end visiting friends. He was night editor and artist and worked for several years after leaving here in 1942 in an editorial capacity for the Fairbanks Daily News-Miner, Fairbanks, Alaska.

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Fire Danger Gets Worse

SALEM (AP) — Fire danger resulted in the closing Monday night by State Forester George Spaul of logging in the coastal area of Clatsop county.

The only areas in the western section of the state remaining open to logging are Jackson, Josephine and the Southern Oregon Coastal counties, he said.

Though fire danger has been high for several days no major fires have been reported.

A serious fire at Cascade Locks was averted Monday.

A sudden blaze broke out shortly after noon at the mouth of Herman Creek on the Columbia River. There was danger for a while that it would jump across a highway and burn into Cascade Locks. But 80 men controlled the blaze after it had burned 15 to 20 acres.

Motor Failure Strands Pair

TOLEDO, Ore. (AP) — Two Albany businessmen were stranded in the ocean for more than 16 hours when the engine of their boat failed during a week-end fishing trip here.

The pair, Robert Jacobson and Glenn Allen, were found Monday morning by the Coast Guard, their boat tied to an ocean navigation buoy. The engine failed Sunday afternoon and the boat had drifted to the buoy.

Families of the men had notified the Coast Guard they were missing.
