

Judy Holliday Admits Stupidity In Aiding Communist-Front Groups

WASHINGTON (U)—Stage and screen star Judy Holliday told Senate investigators that in getting mixed up with various Communist fronts she was irresponsible and more than slightly stupid.

When she had her eyes opened to what was going on, she said, she herself hired people to investigate her.

"I wanted to know what I had done," said the actress who won the Motion Picture Academy Award in 1951 for her portrayal of a dumb blonde in "Born Yesterday."

The Senate internal security subcommittee disclosed today that, at closed-door sessions last spring, it had questioned Miss Holliday, comedian Sam Levenson, actor Philip Love and singer Burt Ives.

The testimony of all four was made public, it showed that they all were asked about Communist front organizations or activities with which their names have been linked. They swore they had never knowingly taken part in any Communist movement.

Levenson and Ives appeared before the subcommittee at their own request.

The Senate group has been probing for any subversive infiltration of the radio, television and entertainment industries.

Today's second volume of testimony, with still more to come, was released by the subcommittee without comment.

In an accompanying statement, however, chairman McCarran (D-Nev.) said that "communism fastens itself like a leech" on the careers of prominent figures in the entertainment world.

He remarked on what he called "the striking number of Communist-controlled organizations and Communist-sponsored activities in which some of the witnesses have involved themselves."

"We do not want to accuse anyone of 'guilt by association,'" McCarran said, "but it is a dangerous type of thinking that leads people into such involvements."

"It is not the sort of thinking that should be permitted to express itself freely in such important media as radio, television and other types of entertainment directed at

the minds of our people."

Miss Holliday was questioned for two hours and 40 minutes at a secret hearing here last March 25. She said she had let her name be used by Communist-front organizations without knowing what they were.

"I have been awakened to a realization that I have been irresponsible and slightly more than slightly stupid," she said. "When I was solicited I always simply said, 'Oh, isn't that too bad. Sure, use my name.'"

"The few things that I actually participated in were things that I couldn't possibly have thought were subversive."

At another point the actress said of herself: "It was an irresponsible attitude mostly on an emotional basis for a quick 'yes' for anybody that sounded to me like they were getting the wrong end of something."

Asked when she had changed, Miss Holliday replied:

"When I began to realize the possible imminence of a war, when I began to realize that there were such things as spies and people working against the country. I know that the whole tenor of my thinking changed considerably in the last two years."

Before ending her testimony, Miss Holliday presented a statement in which she said that she never was a member of the Communist party, that she was opposed to communism and that she was wholeheartedly devoted to democracy.

Miss Holliday, who was born Judy Tuvim, testified that in 1948 she was for Henry A. Wallace for president and registered as a member of the left-wing American Labor party. She said she thought of it as "a sort of middle party."

Asked if she and her husband, David Oppenheim, ever discussed politics, Miss Holliday replied: "Only lately. And boy, we talk about nothing else now."

Similarly, when asked if she now watches organizations to which she contributes money, Miss Holliday exclaimed: "Oh, do I watch it now."

A few minutes later she said "I don't say 'yes' to anything now except cancer, polio, and cerebral palsy, and things like that."

Levenson, a former Brooklyn high school teacher who has won a reputation on television as a humorist, told the subcommittee he had asked to appear "to clear up certain misconceptions which might help you and help me."

Testifying last March 20, Levenson brought with him a to-whom-it-may-concern letter from Harvey Matusow, a former Communist who turned informer for the FBI and who now is employed by the Ohio Un-American Commission.

Levenson said he had read an account of testimony by Matusow before the House Un-American Activities Committee last February implying that Levenson had "knowingly accepted bookings from a

Communist-dominated organization."

Levenson testified the organization he was referring to was People's Artists. Subcommittee counsel previously had identified People's Artists, Inc., as the artist's division of People's Songs, Inc.

After learning of Matusow's testimony, Levenson said, he went to Matusow to "clarify to him the meaning of my name in this listing with People's Artists." Matusow then gave him the letter he presented to the Senate group, Levenson said.

Matusow wrote that "having been an employee of People's Artists in 1948 and actively engaged in Communist party activities through that organization, I can attest to the fact that no evidence of Communist party membership has been undertaken by Mr. Levenson during my personal participation in these affairs."

Ives, in his voluntary appearance before the subcommittee, said he had participated in the activities of a number of Communist-front organizations without knowing their true nature.

The ballad singer testified "the only affiliation that I have had with communism was back in the spring of 1944." At that time, he said, he attended some open discussion meetings of the Communist Political Association.

Ives said he did not go to these meetings as a Communist but to find out about communism. After going to a few of these meetings, he said, he decided to leave and it has never come back into my mind, the possibility of being a Communist, because I am against that philosophy."

Loeb, an actor on the New York stage for many years who also has played in motion pictures, was the husband of Mollie in the Goldberger radio program until, as he put it, he was "thrown off the air."

Testifying last April 23, Loeb said he was dropped from the program after his name was connected by Red Channels, a book which the publishers described as a report on Communist infiltration in radio and television.

Loeb swore "I never was a Communist in my life" and testified that he never had knowingly been connected with any Communist movement.

FBI Captures Wanted Man

BOISE, Idaho (U)—Thomas Edward Young, 34, one of the FBI's "10 most wanted" fugitives, and his wife Margaret, 32, were surprised and captured yesterday by FBI agents in the wild, rugged Boise National Forest.

The couple, cornered on a lonely one-way mountain road, surrendered meekly although they were heavily armed.

The FBI had searched for the couple intensively since they escaped from the Fargo, N. D., jail last Dec. 27. They were held there after arraignment on charges of robbing two North Dakota Post-offices.

The two fugitives were arraigned before U. S. Commissioner Glenn A. Coughlan and held on bonds set at \$25,000 each.

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Wafdist Head Won't Resign

CAIRO, Egypt (U)—Former Premier Mustafa el Nahas has openly defied the pressure of Egypt's reform government to oust him from his longtime post as head of the once-powerful Wafdist party.

In a statement to the pro-Wafdist newspaper Al Misri, the popular 75-year-old party leader last night said: "There is no power in the world that will force me to quit the leadership of the Wafdist party but the power of God or of the Egyptian people."

The government of Premier Mst. Gen. Mohammed Naguib has demanded that all Egyptian political parties purge themselves of persons suspected of graft and corruption and reorganize themselves to be eligible for official recognition. The Wafd has been one of the main targets of the purge movement.

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
