Foodmen Want Milk Change

Ron Phair, president of the local Grocers Association and newly elected vice president of the Oregon Food Merchants Association, reported that the Oregon group took one stand on the state milk laws at its meeting in Portland Monday.

The association went on record as favoring a price differential of 1 cent a quart between cash and carry milk prices and home delivery.

The group feels that retail stores

should be allowed to sell the milk a cent cheaper than the charge for delivery, but other wise ask for no change in the milk setup, he said.

The Indians named in the action are Abernethy Logan, Ethel Garip, Mr. and Mrs. John Logan, Mr. and Mrs. James Logan, Mr. and Mrs. Walter J. Easter and Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Logan. They say they hold patent to the land.

Oregon Sets Work Record

SALEM 24 — More people worked in Oregon during August than ever before, and they earned a record amount of money, the State Unemployment Compensation Commission said Wednesday.

There were 460,600 persons employed in non-farm jobs, which was 1,500 more than the previous record of two years ago.

The average weekly wage during the month soared to a new high of \$52.29, compared with \$47.21 a year ago.

Weekly wages in the construction industry climbed to \$97.07, and to \$91.53 in the lumber industry.
