Acheson Raps Commie Smear

WASHINGTON (AP)—Secretary of State Acheson said Friday a sharp attack on Ambassador George F. Kennan by Moscow's official Communist paper Pravda is wholly unjustified and improper. Pravda called the American envoy in Moscow a "liar" who lied about the Soviet Union and is an enemy of Russia.

The criticism was based on a statement by Kennan comparing life for Americans in Moscow now to the life of internees under German Nazis in wartime.

Acheson, asked about the attack at his news conference, said Kennan's quoted remarks seemed to be a very calm and accurate description of what life is like in Moscow.

Kennan made his comments to reporters at Berlin's Tempelhof airport.

During a stopover there Sept. 19, the U.S. envoy said that Russians recently have been forbidden all social contact with Americans in Moscow. Recalling his experiences while interned in Germany in 1941-42, Kennan said, "had the Nazis permitted us to walk the streets without having any right to talk to any Germans, that would be precisely how we have to live today in Moscow."

Tugboat Man Found Safe

KODIAK, Alaska (AP)—A lone and weakened tugboat operator, adrift for 11 days and reported overdue for 20, was found on a Kodiak Island beach Thursday—down to his last four potatoes.

Tom Eley, 58, was found near a cave by two duck hunters. Except for his weakened condition, he was reported O.K.

Eley said he ran into trouble when the engine of his 36-foot tugboat, the *Popeye II*, quit off Cape Resurrection, south of Seward.

He started the trip with 50 gallons of water but it turned rancid after a few days.

Asked what he thought about during the lonely drifting, he replied: "My wife's worrying about me."

He is the father of six children, and a resident of Alaska since 1911.

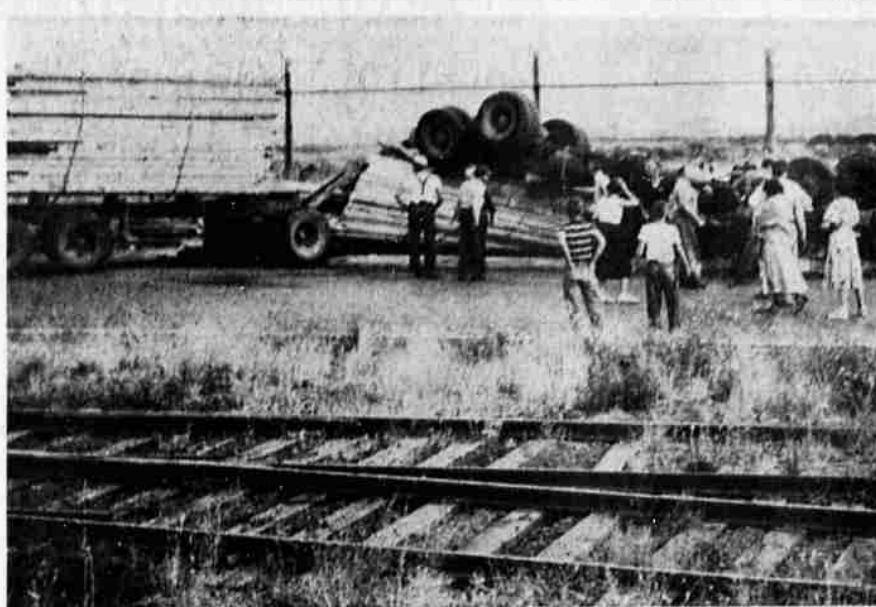

Crew Saved From Ice Cap

LONDON (AP)—The British Air Ministry said Friday a rescue plane has snatched from a Greenland ice cap the last nine members of a bomber crew stranded by a crash on Sept. 16.

Three other men had been picked up by a ski plane from the U.S. Greenland air base of Thule two days ago. Bad weather delayed the rescue of the others.

The airmen—British and one American—were marooned when their Hastings bomber crumpled a wing soon after making a supply drop to a British expedition which plans to winter on the ice cap.

The first three taken off suffered minor injuries. The others were reported unhurt.

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Census Bureau said Friday the median income of all earners rose ten percent in 1951, with earnings of men making a record gain.

Farm and non-farm earners both earned more in 1951, the bureau said. It said the earnings of women rose the least.

The bureau based its estimates on sample pollings.

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Red Leaflet Sent To U.S.

TACOMA (AP)—A 50-page illustrated Chinese Communist propaganda leaflet, sent to a former Tacoma mother of a U. S. soldier killed in Korea, was intercepted in the Tacoma mails Thursday by acting Postmaster John P. McMonagle.

McMonagle termed the booklet "vile, but professionally done," and said he was sending it immediately to Washington, D.C., so that Postal Department officials could ban the booklets from the mails.

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
