Brannan Lauds Adlai Stand

SEATTLE (AP) — Secretary of Agriculture Brannan killed two birds with one stone Monday. He got in a plug for Gov. Adlai Stevenson, the Democrats' presidential nominee, and appeared before the National Association of State Commissioners, Directors and Secretaries of Agriculture.

Brannan said in an interview that Stevenson and the Democratic Party have the farmers' interests most at heart. He charged that the voting record of Republicans in Congress shows they have been opposed to "all farm programs that have helped the farmers and the public."

"The nation's farmers cannot possibly rely on the Republican Party for any assurance that our very successful farm program of the past 20 years will be continued," the secretary said.

Inflation Hits City Budgets

PORTLAND (AP) — The Portland Office of Price Stabilization reported Sunday that inflation was causing major increases in the budgets of many Oregon cities.

Director Carl Donough said a survey shows that one-fourth of each local tax dollar will be used to meet the rising cost of inflation.

Salem's loss was estimated at about \$785,000 out of its current budget of \$3,181,740. Corvallis lost an estimated \$521,000 of its current two million dollar budget.

Portland lost \$260,000 out of a million dollar budget. And Springfield lost \$128,000 out of a budget of a \$512,408.

Portland, Astoria, Medford and Bend will lose comparatively less to inflation, the report said, because their budgets haven't climbed as much.

Progressives Rap Arrests

EUGENE (AP) — The Oregon Progressive Party, holding its third annual convention here, protested the recent arrest of 18 persons from the West Coast and Michigan, accused of being Communists.

The arrests, the resolution said, were an "attempt to silence opposition to the American war policy" of the United States.

Delegates gave unanimous endorsement to the Progressive presidential ticket—Vincent Hallinan of San Francisco for president and Mrs. Chastita Bass, San Francisco Negro, for vice president.

Roy Stauffer of Eugene was elected chairman. Other officers: Mrs. Helen Neuenchwander, Portland, secretary; Don Brown, Coos Bay, national committeeman, and Sue Driscoll, national committeewoman.

Truman May Attack Press

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Frank Carlson (R-Kan.) says he has learned from reliable sources that President Truman plans to subject several newspapers to a thorough government probe in an attempt to retaliate for their revelations of scandals in his administration.

"It smacks of strong attempts to browbeat the press," Carlson said in a statement.

Carlson, a supporter of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, the Republican nominee for president, said he was told that Truman plans to have the Justice Department subpoena files, letters, memoranda and records of newspapers during the closing weeks of the political campaign.

"The sending of a horde of government agents into the newspapers offices during an election campaign may be Truman's idea of silencing opposition," Carlson said. "It will not work."

"He will learn on Nov. 4 that the revelations by the free press of the United States have compelled our people to demand a change."

The first newspaper involved in such an investigation, Carlson said, was the Kansas City Star. He said all of the Star's records and files have been subpoenaed.

In Kansas City, Roy A. Roberts, president of the Kansas City Star, said it was true that the government had subpoenaed all the newspapers financial records, minute books and files covering a period of 25 years.

Reds Fight Over Woman

RANGOON, Burma (AP) — A Burmese "Helen of Troy" is blamed for a clash between Communists in the Meiktila area of central Burma that cost 23 lives.

The story, as related here: Bo Kyi Saing, a commander of the Communist rebels, fell in love with Ma Saw Yi, a pretty school-teacher. They ran away and got married. But duty called and Bo Kyi Saing had to go underground.

Time passed on Ma Saw Yi's hands. Pretty soon Yin Maung Yin, another Red military leader, found favor in her eyes.

Then Bo Kyi Saing returned to his wife for a visit. Yin Maung Yin was out on Red military business. He heard about the visit and marched down to take Bo Kyi Saing captive. A court of village elders sentenced Bo Kyi Saing to death.

When word of this drifted back to Bo Kyi Saing's followers they vowed revenge. In a battle Yin Maung Yin and 18 of his men were killed. Four on the other side also were slain.

What happened to the pretty Ma Saw Yi she fled at the height of the battle and is hiding away in the jungle—presumably along for the time being.

Coal Workers Contract Due

WASHINGTON (AP)—A fat new contract with Northern soft coal operators was due to be ratified today by the United Mine Workers' Policy Committee.

Final details of the agreement were worked out over the week end between Union President John L. Lewis and Harry Moses, representing the Northern owners.

The agreement calls for a \$1.50 a day increase boosting the basic daily wage to \$18.25, plus a 10-cent-a-ton hike in the 30-cent royalty paid by owners into the union's welfare fund.
