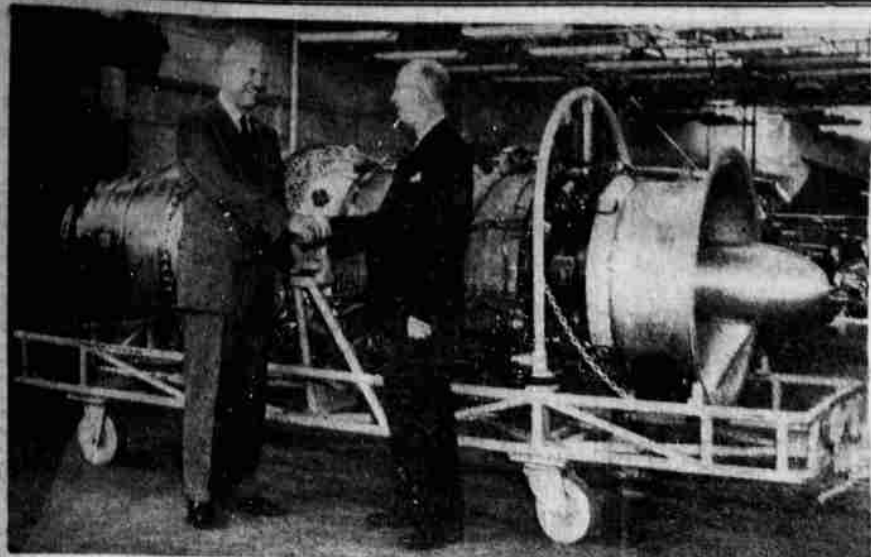

Russian Troops Supporting North Korean Armed Forces

SEOUL, Korea (U) — A highly placed U. S. Eighth Army officer said Tuesday there are from 5,000 to 6,000 Russian soldiers in rear areas of North Korea serving in a "support capacity."

This officer said in an interview that the Russians were technicians and advisors and probably manned modern radar-controlled anti-aircraft guns manufactured in the Soviet Union.

The officer cannot be identified but he holds a responsible post that qualified him to speak authoritatively.

He conceded that some of those reported to be Russians could be East Europeans from Soviet Satellite countries.

The officers described the anti-aircraft batteries at Red airfields south of the big Antung bases in Manchuria as modern stuff.

He added that because available evidence has shown them to be manned by Caucasians it was assumed Russians were at the guns.

His statements went much farther than those of a North Korean officer who surrendered through the Panmunjom neutral zone early this month.

The Communist lieutenant, who was security officer at the armistice site, said last Saturday that he had seen about 20 Russians at the Sinuiju airfield in June, 1951. The airfield is in North Korea at the Manchurian border.

The North Korean also said he had heard that Russian advisors were attached to the North Korean army officers staff school and that he had heard of Russian pilots flying Communist jets.

High ranking American officers have stated that Russian speaking pilots in Communist jets have been heard by Allied airmen who overheard inter-com messages.

The Eighth Army officer said "there is no question that there

are Russians up there in North Korea." He declined to say precisely how many beyond placing the figure at "several thousand."

Too Much Talk About Funds Says Arkansas Fulbright

WASHINGTON (U)—Sen. J. William Fulbright said today both Republicans and Democrats are devoting too much attention to probing each other's political and expense funds.

"I don't think that any of these people on either side are dishonest corrupt politicians," the Arkansas Democrat told reporters. He added:

"All of this obscures the real fundamental issues of the presidential campaign and leaves the impression with the public that everybody is corrupt."

Fulbright was commenting on the special expense fund for Sen. Richard M. Nixon, the Republican vice presidential nominee, and the Illinois campaign fund of Gov. Adlai Stevenson, Democratic pres-

idential nominee, used to augment salaries of key state officials.

Fulbright said the charges and counter-charges "develop a name-calling and low-level campaign."

"That's bad enough in a campaign for a county constable," he said. "It certainly has no place in a national presidential campaign."

Fulbright said he agrees with Nixon that senators from larger states, such as California, do not have large enough salaries and expense funds from regular sources.

He added that members of Congress "are too sensitive" in voting on their own pay and allowances and this should be done by an outside commission of non-governmental leaders.

At the same time, Fulbright said Nixon's nation-wide explanation of his special fund from Californians, via television, radio and the press, "left a false impression."

He said most people now believe that Nixon used this fund to avoid extra expenses to the taxpayers.

"One of the biggest items was for thousands of Christmas cards," Fulbright said. "That never could or should be paid for by the taxpayers."



Controls Off For 2 Hours

ALLENTOWN, Pa. (U)—Off went rent controls in this Eastern Pennsylvania city yesterday.

Back they came again just two hours later.

For months the City Council gathered data on the question of keeping rent controls. After many hearings and debates, the Council voted unanimously yesterday to lift them. This was done under a 1952 federal law which leaves the question to local governments.

About two hours later, Rep. Karl

C. King (R-Pa.) was notified that federal authorities had classified the city as a critical defense area—and rent controls were to be restored.

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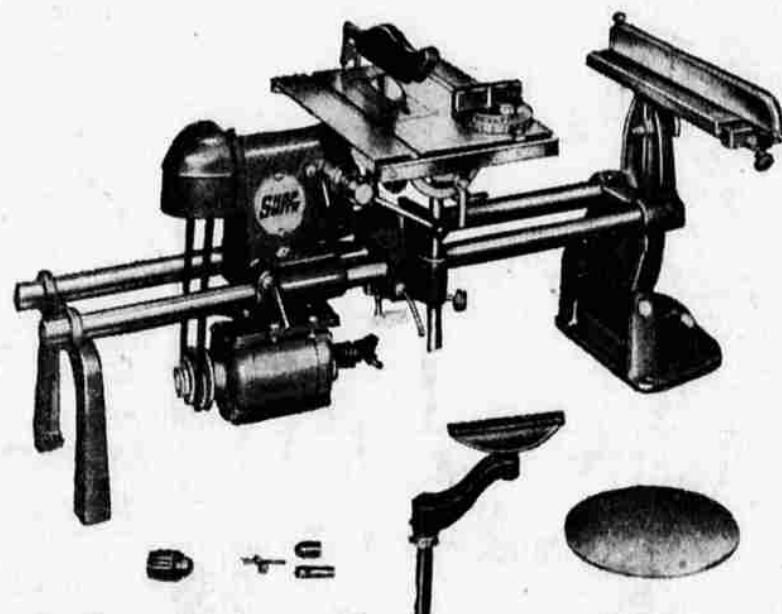

French To Fix US Air Bases

PARIS (U)—French officials say that repairs will be made on scheduled, or with "very slight" delays, to defective runways on three air bases in France assigned to the U. S. Air Force.

American officials said Saturday that U. S. jet planes had been unable to use the fields because the runways were soft, crumbling or badly cracked. The fields are at Chaumont and Toul-Rosiere in Eastern France, and at Laon-Couvron in Northeast France.
