Fluoridation Endorsed By Oregon State Health Board

Another endorsement of fluoridation of Klamath Falls' water supply was received by the City Council last night, from David M. Witter, director of the dental health section of the Oregon State Board of Health.

Witter wrote that fluoridation, such as is planned here, is beyond the experimental stage now, and that cities with as much as seven years' experience have proved that the addition of fluoride ions to drinking water lessens tooth decay.

He took exception to the objection to fluoridation expressed by a religious group, the Christian Scientists, that fluoridation constituted mass medication.

"Fluoridation does not constitute 'mass medication,'" he wrote the City Council. "It does not treat an existing disease. Fluoridation supplies a normal constituent found in human teeth."

It is no more a medication, Witter said, than the addition of vitamins to certain types of prepared foods.

The City Council took no action last night on the fluoridation issue. A proposed ordinance requesting the Oregon Water Corporation to proceed with the addition of fluoride ions to the water has been sent to the water company for its study.

Other City Council activity last night included:

Approval of \$71,488 worth of building permits.

Authority for City Engineer Tait Thomas to install a guy wire to straighten a light pole at 6th and Klamath. Thomas reported that the pole is leaning, causing the traffic light out in the intersection to swing and brush against the top of big trucks as they under.

Authority for Thomas to improve a sidewalk along city property on the west side of Link River Bridge, at a cost of about \$100. Thomas also was instructed to make an estimate of how much installation of a concrete sidewalk on the east side of the bridge along Veterans Memorial Park property would cost.

For several years the City Council has been trying to get the Park Board to put in that walk.

At Conroy, former councilman, made a short talk urging that the Council go on record in favor of the state legislature measure to use a weight-mile basis of truck taxation and against the trucking industry's ballot measure to outlaw any type of highway taxes except license plate fees and fuel taxes.
