



Simple sewing plus a small amount of time are all that's needed to transform a corner of your kitchen into a breakfast nook. A breakfast nook, these days, is a time-saver and a short cut to easier living. You may use a table (left) or just a long shelf fastened to the wall. We used a print fabric, working with shirring tape, to make place mats, chair backs and seat covers, cafe curtains and even a lamp shade (lower right). For trim, we used cotton fringe in bright colors. The result is a rich, coordinated look at a tiny cost.

Hot Soups Welcome On Cool Days

Good, hot soup has many virtues, most of them applicable to snappy fall weather and the rather substantial appetites developed therefrom. It looks good, it tastes good, and if it's the rich creamy kind, it goes a long way toward satisfying those appetites. Corn and potato chowder is exactly that kind of soup—just the ticket for a Saturday supper.

CORN AND POTATO CHOWDER

- 1/2 pound diced salt pork
- 1 cup finely chopped onions
- 1 cup diced raw potatoes
- 1 cup boiling water
- 2 1/2 cups (1 No. 2 can) whole kernel corn
- 2 cups milk
- 1 teaspoon flour
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper

2 tablespoons minced parsley

1 cup Rice Krispies.
Cook salt pork in frying pan until brown and crisp. Lift from fat and drain. Cook onions in salt pork fat until tender and slightly browned. Drain onions, reserving fat, and put into soup kettle; add potatoes and water; cover and cook ten minutes. Add corn and milk. Make smooth paste of one tablespoon of the salt pork fat and flour, stir

into soup. Continue cooking about ten minutes. Stir in seasonings and parsley; serve in warmed bowls.
Brown Rice Krispies in one tablespoon of the salt pork fat. Drain well, combine with crisp salt pork cubes. Serve in separate bowl with chowder.
Yield: 6 servings.
