Soviet Industrialism Growing, Reports Stalin

MOSCOW (AP)—Joseph Stalin says the economic strength of the Communist world is growing steadily while the West's resources are declining.

Communist nations soon will be able to export surplus merchandise, he declares.

Stalin also asserted Thursday, in his first major statement in more than two years, that war between capitalist and Communist nations is not likely.

But he maintained war is inevitable between the capitalist nations themselves and mentioned Britain, France, Italy, Japan and West Germany as countries that may "eventually try to break out of American bondage."

The Russian leader's views were set forth in a 50-page article in the magazine *Bolshevik*, a leading Soviet theoretical journal.

Its publication came just before the opening of the first Soviet Communist party congress since World War II—an event expected to result in new disclosures of Communist policy.

Stalin's article, entitled "Economic Problems of Socialism in the U. S. S. R.," was unquestionably the most important economic policy statement made in Russia since World War II.

In the statement, the Premier asserted that the West's economic blockade of the Soviet bloc had resulted in such rapid industrial development of the Communist nations that they can expect to soon stop importing goods and instead look for markets for their own surpluses.

Stalin also laid down a partial blueprint for Russia's future economic course, forecasting:

1. Basic changes in the collective farm organization to be made in the near future. The ultimate goal will be a direct exchange of farm produce for industrial products, rather than the present system of selling the farm surplus in the open market.
2. Doubling of worker's real wages and a reduction in the work day from the present eight hours to six and later to five.
3. Introduction of universal compulsory polytechnical education to give persons freedom to change their professions and keep them from being "shackled" for life to one job.

(All these points obviously are internal propaganda. It had been expected that the Soviet people would be promised once again in connection with a party Congress that there would be new steps "on the road to Communism.")

"The Soviet Union does not even have a standard eight-hour day at the present time."

(In fact, the speedup in both industry and agriculture indicates much longer hours, and hints in the Soviet press point to sharp criticism of those who entertained ideas of shorter hours.)

(The promise of higher pay—in the future—also has been expected, but the indications in recent Soviet pronouncements have been that the Soviet workers would work more hours for less actual pay.)

Possibly another "price reduc-

tion" is in the making as a sop to the workers.)

Stalin said the West actually created a new world economic arrangement when it blockaded Russia and the other nations that did not join the Marshall plan.

The non-Marshall nations, he declared, joined together in their own mutual aid program.

Stalin said the resources of the United States, Britain and France are on the decline and that nations know it will be difficult for them to make up for the loss of such markets as China and the

U. S. S. R. He claimed they were trying to make up for the loss by the Marshall Plan, the Korean war and the arms race "but this is very like a drowning man seizing at straw."

Vancouver TV Transmitter To Cover 50 Mile Radius

WASHINGTON (AP)—The television station proposed by Vancouver (Wash.) Radio Corp. would cover an area roughly 50 miles on all sides of the Columbia River, a witness told a Communications Commission examiner Thursday.

Howard T. Head, consulting radio engineer for the company, said signals would be received clearly within 25-30 miles of Vancouver with less reliable reception up to 40 miles.

The company is contesting with Mt. Scott Telecasters Inc., Portland, Ore., for Channel 21. Although the channel is assigned to Portland, commission rules permit applications to be considered from cities which have no television assignment and are within 15 miles of the designation.

Exhibits introduced by Head showed the proposed station's service pattern would extend north from Vancouver to Kelso, Wash., east to Carson, Wash., south to Salem, Ore., and 45-50 miles to the west.

He said the company plans to locate its transmitter and a 254-foot tower and antenna at Healy Heights, 1 1/2 miles west of Council Crest in Portland. Studies would be in Vancouver.

Dwight D. Loomis, Portland engineer, showed technical engineering testimony for Mt. Scott earlier with the assertion that he had been informed, on the basis of tests conducted in connection with Portland's single TV station now in operation, that the city is "unsuitably wooded" for television.

A possibility for future delay in the proceedings developed with the filing by the commission's broadcast bureau of a petition to enlarge issues of the hearing to determine the possibility of interference

Three Jap Ships Missing

TOKYO (AP)—Three ships with 24 fishermen were missing after tidal waves and high winds lashed the shores of Hokkaido Island Friday.

Nine of the fishermen were feared drowned when their ships overturned. Fifteen others are believed adrift on the Pacific.

Eighty houses and 23 fishing vessels were damaged.

The tidal waves were about 12 feet high.

The winds and waves were a result of a typhoon that passed between Honshu and Hokkaido islands.
