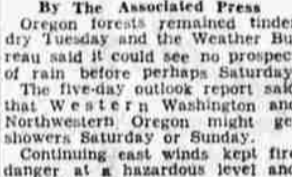

Oregon forests remained tinder dry Tuesday and the Weather Bureau said it could see no prospect of rain before perhaps Saturday.

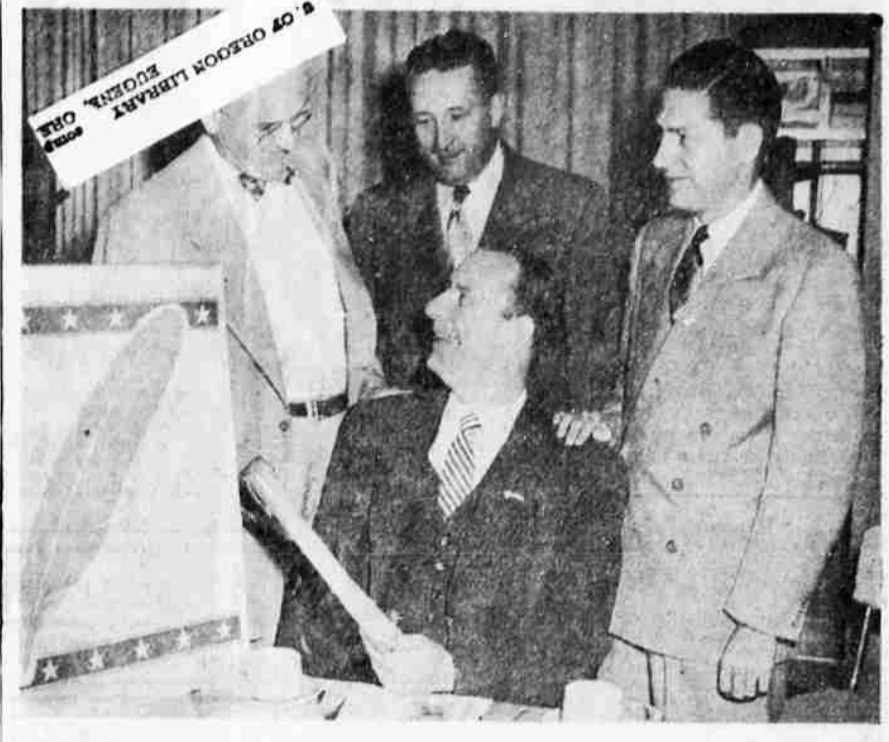

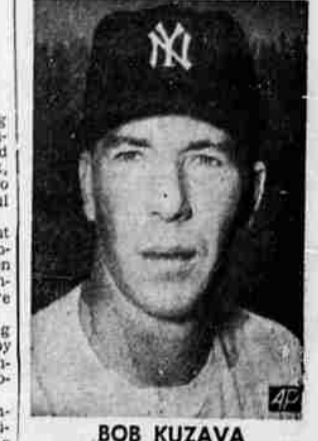
