

Wrestling Run Opens Tonight

Hunt Wages War On Toot-Happy Officials

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Graying Al Hunt is a football coach who is just about fed up with over-sealous officials. He thinks he has cause.

In the two games Hunt's Valley Junior College team has played, officials have called a total of 77 alleged infractions and marched off 415 yards.

The first, with Taft Junior College 10 days ago, saw 53 penalty calls on 333 assessed — 240 for Hunt's team, 95 for Taft.

Last weekend against Santa Monica, J. C. officials virtually took the night off. They only dropped the hanky 24 times and doled out 280 yards.

Hunt, a graduate of Occidental College and for nearly a decade a successful high school and junior college mentor, said he did not want to blow the whistle on the whistle blowers. Rules must be enforced.

"But, up at Taft," he recalled, "it took an hour and two minutes to play the first quarter."

There were no two series of plays in which a penalty wasn't called. They called 37 offside penalties against us, most of them in

the first half. To get the ball game over, I played my kids a yard and a half back of the line of scrimmage in the second half—but the tootin' kept on.

"We finally got the game over in 20 minutes to midnight."

Hunt had no argument with the scores. He beat Taft 35-3, and Santa Monica 7-0.

Stocks To Race In KF

Approval of the Klamath Gold Cup stock car race scheduled at Klamath County Fair Grounds Oct. 19 as a West Coast Championship battle at the 160-lap distance was announced today.

The American Racing Association, invited to sanction the race here, has approved the Championship designation, according to Charles Curryer, race director.

Fred Frame, Indianapolis "500" winner and ARA official referee, stated that the Championship status for the race here was allowed since the half mile Fair Grounds track has been tested and approved by the Association.

The Klamath Gold Cup and a large purse offered for the race of new stock cars and the anticipated crowd for the Oct. 19 race here was believed to be the other considerations involved.

Designation as the 160 lap West Coast championship race is expected to result in an even larger entry list as some of the owners and drivers anticipate the race for the purpose of testing their cars for the Mexican Road race they have entered, which is to be run in November.

Al Frager, in charge of entries, said all the leading pilots of the Pacific Coast and many who have entered the Mexican Road race indicated interest in the Klamath event and he expects a flood of entries momentarily.

Herb McGriff, winner of the 1950 Mexican road race; Marvin Panch, Oakland Speedway and Eureka stock car race winner; and Dick Meyer of Porterville who drove his Mercury to first place in the Reno stock car race, have assured Frager that they would be here battling for the first spot and the Championship Gold Cup.

Entry blanks have been sent to the Pacific Coast's best stock car ARA owners and drivers as well as to the local automobile dealers and agencies, explaining the rules and that all American makes of cars such as Oldsmobile, Buick, Cadillac, Chrysler, Mercury, Studebaker, Ford, Plymouth, Pontiac, Desoto and the like are eligible providing they are strictly stock 1950 to 1952 models, and that fenders, top (no convertibles allowed) headlights, bumpers, starter, generator, and fans must be intact and stock engines used.

New late model stock car racing in Southern Oregon will be a first-in-this-area racing attraction. Local automobile agencies and dealers are especially invited to participate with local drivers or drivers furnished by the association. Racing fans will be able to see their favorite make of car driven at top speed by local drivers and topnotch pros.

Beshore Stops Kahut

PORTLAND (AP) — Freddie Beshore of Oakland, Calif., was awarded a knockout over Joe Kahut of Woodburn, Ore., in the eighth round of their scheduled 10-round main event heavyweight boxing match here Tuesday.

The veteran Kahut, bleeding badly from a cut under his left eye received in the fourth, told Referee Ralph Grumann at the end of the seven rounds he was unable to continue. The fight was awarded to Beshore as an eight round knockout.

Beshore weighed 197; Kahut 181.

Harold Kottre, 161 1/2, Silverton, Ore., stopped Paul Kennedy, 157 1/2, Longview, Wash., at 2:55 of the second round of another scheduled 10-round bout.

Eddie Kahut, 160, Joe's brother, was given a unanimous 10-round decision over Sonty Green, 160 1/2, Trenton, N.J., in a preliminary.

Yard-Stingy Middies Top Defensive Team

NEW YORK (AP) — Navy's opponents are finding out this year that when it comes to giving up yardage, the Middies are a bunch of misers.

In games so far this season, Navy's two rivals, Yale and Cornell, together averaged only 3 1/2 inches per try at the Blue and Gold's rock-ribbed line.

As a result, Navy tops the nation's major college football teams in total defense (125 yards against per game) and rushing defense (four yards per game), according to figures released Wednesday by the NCAA's Service Bureau.

CINCINNATI (AP) — Ezzard Charles of Cincinnati, still hopeful of being the first man ever to regain a once-lost heavyweight boxing championship, tries again Wednesday to get started back on the trail to a title bout.

Charles will meet Bernie Reynolds of Fairfield, Conn., in a 12-round nationally televised bout at the Cincinnati Garden.

The 25-year-old Reynolds has 30 knockouts among his 52 victories but he has been an in-and-out-er and the betting boys had made Charles a solid favorite at 2 to 1.

The bout will start at 7 p.m. PST.
