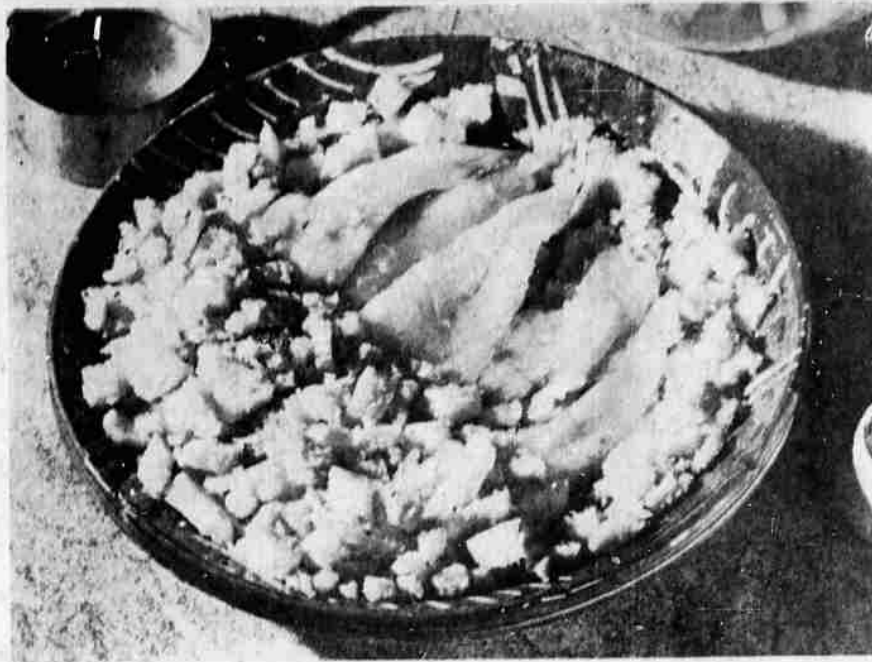

COD FILLETS

Cod Fillets Inexpensive

Cod fillets continue to be a good buy throughout the United States. Catches of this white-meat, tender fish have been so tremendous the last several months, that more than 15,000,000 pounds are frozen in fillet form—10,000,000 pounds more than were available at this time last year. That's a lot of delicious no-waste, inexpensive protein food waiting for American dinner tables. To make a budget food still less expensive, here's a recipe in which fillets are combined with a popular extender, crispy bread crumbs, to make a fish pie.

BREAD CRUMBS FILLET PIE
 1 package frozen fish fillets (cod, haddock, ocean perch)
 1 cup butter or margarine
 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
 3 tablespoons vinegar
 1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon pepper
 3 cups soft bread crumbs
 Thaw fillets. Melt butter in sauce pan. Add Worcestershire sauce, vinegar, salt and pepper. Place bread crumbs in bowl. Add only enough melted butter mixture to moisten. Pat half bread crumbs out in bottom of flat baking dish. Lay thawed fillets over this. Cover with remaining bread crumbs. Pour remaining butter sauce over this. Bake at 450 F. (hot oven) 10 minutes or until fish flakes easily with fork. Cut into serving size portions with sharp knife and serve with flat server. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

PRETTY TOUCH

Port is a lovely wine to serve for dessert when you're entertaining. It's a beautifully colored, full-bodied wine which gives you the fruity sweetness of grapes yet is not "syrupy". Serve small glasses of Port with almond cookie bars, it will delight your guests.
