Court Action Finally Ends Complicated Marital Career

SALEM, O. - The complicated matrimonial career of Leo Elwert, wealthy Washington County nurseryman, came to the end of a dead end street Wednesday. The Oregon Supreme Court gave Elwert's wife separate maintenance.

This decision, in which the court gave Elwert a severe bawling out, made void Elwert's marriage to Greta, the other woman, and made it impossible for him to marry her, either.

Justice Harold J. Warner, who wrote the opinion, called Elwert's activities with Greta "a sad and sordid tale of meretricious intrigue and brazen philandering, perjury and legal deception."

Barbara Says No To Rumors

HOLLYWOOD, O. - Barbara Stanwyck denies there is any truth to rumors that she and Robert Taylor are about to become reconciled—even though they were seen holding hands at Ciro's Tuesday night.

Miss Stanwyck, divorced from Taylor early this year, said yesterday that the hand-holding "doesn't mean a thing except that we remain good friends."

"There has been no talk whatever of remarriage," she told a newsman.

As for Taylor, his studio said he had no comment.

The Elwerts were married in 1926 and have two daughters. He has a prosperous nursery on his father's farm near Sherwood.

Things went along peacefully until 1945 when Elwert met Greta, a married woman whose last name the Supreme Court doesn't know.

Elwert bought a motel and installed Greta as manager. The motel was located near the Elwert nursery.

Greta's husband didn't like the arrangement, so he sued Elwert for alienation of affections. The case was settled out of court, Elwert having to pay Greta's husband \$9,000.

Then Greta and her husband were divorced.

In July, 1948, the Supreme Court says, Elwert took Greta on a trip to Hawaii, posing as a man and wife.

But the blow that Mrs. Elwert couldn't take came when the Elwert nursery issued its 1949 calendar.

The nursery's calendars had a picture of a pretty girl on them. But the 1949 calendar had Greta's picture, with the words "my girl" at the bottom.

Elwert went to Idaho and got a divorce, even though the Idaho court said it had doubts whether Elwert was a legal resident of that state. Then he married Greta in Idaho.

Mrs. Elwert didn't bear about the divorce until after it was granted. So she filed suit in Multnomah County for separate maintenance, won it there, and this decision was upheld Wednesday.

If Mrs. Elwert had sought a divorce, that would have freed Elwert to marry Greta again. But her separate maintenance suit stops that.

Justice Warner also wrote that Elwert "did not burn his bridges behind him; on the contrary, he kept them in a state of constant use and repair."

The decision holds the Idaho court was defrauded on the question of Elwert's residence. This throws out both the Idaho divorce and Elwert's marriage to Greta.
