

Coaching Job Seen for Campanella

O'Malley Explores Proposal

 BROOKLYN (AP) — Roy Campanella, Brooklyn's popular catching star, may become the first Negro big league coach.

Walter P. O'Malley, owner of the Dodgers, disclosed today he and the club's all-star receiver had discussed the idea at some length and that he was all in favor of employing Campanella as a Dodger coach "in a few years."

"I don't see why Roy can't turn to coaching when his playing days are over," the executive said. "He's intelligent, level-headed, well-liked by both players and fans, and I think he'd make a fine coach."

O'Malley added: "I believe the color angle is a thing of the past in baseball. Roy and (Jackie) Robinson and the rest have taken care of that by their wonderful performance. They've been a credit to the game and not even the severest critics could point a finger at their behavior."

STIPULATION

The only stipulation I made to Roy was this: I told him he must take care of himself. By that I mean he must watch his weight. He has a tendency to put on a lot of poundage during the off-season. I want him to set an example to the others. Before he learns to handle other men, he's not to be able to handle himself. The weight problem is the only obstacle to his chances of remaining in the Dodger organization for years to come."

O'Malley said he believed the 31-year-old Campanella could continue as a top-ranking star for five more years provided he took care of himself. He regards Roy as the best catcher and one of the greatest clutch hitters in baseball.

BARNSTORM

Campanella corroborated O'Malley's disclosure. The 5-foot 9-inch receiver, who left today for a barnstorming trip through the Southland with a group of Negro stars including Joe Black, Monte Irvin, Hank Thompson, Luke Easter and Larry Doby, expressed his gratitude to O'Malley and promised he would do everything in his power to fulfill his boss' confidence in him.

"Mr. O'Malley has offered me a great opportunity," he said sincerely. "and you can bet I'm not going to flub it. He's worried about my weight, but he needn't. I weigh about 200 now. That's my best playing weight. I promise never to go beyond that."

Tillamook will be host to the powerhouse from Central Catholic and the Rams may further enhance their No. 3 position in the eyes of the sportswriters. Last week they trounced Astoria 49-6 while Tillamook was losing to lightly regarded Parkrose. It is a District 3 game.

The poll's No. 4 team, Grant of Portland, is favored to win over Roosevelt, and the No. 8 team, Franklin, is favored over Washington.

Prineville, only Class A-2 team in the poll's top 10, goes to Baker and is expected to keep its record clean.

Hillsboro and Newberg meet in a District 4 contest. The poll puts Hillsboro in seventh place and left Newberg unranked.

Eugene, which lost stature in an unexpected 20-6 trouncing from Klamath Falls last week, is expected to be easily good enough to win its non-district game with Corvallis.

The 16th team in the poll, Baker, goes to Pendleton and is favored to win that District 7 game.

Wisconsin-Ohio State Tilt Tops Grid Menu

 NEW YORK (AP) — Wisconsin comes upon another big obstacle on the rocky road to the Big 10 championship and the Rose Bowl tomorrow when the No. 1 team in the country takes on Ohio State.

This is the top battle of a full schedule of important league and inter-sectional affairs.

Wisconsin vaulted to the top spot in the land in The Associated Press poll last week on the basis of its stunning triumph over Illinois, the defending league champion. This Ohio State team doesn't approach some of the former powerhouses from Columbus, but it should give Ivy Williamson's lads a run for their money.

Rare are the days when an Ivy League game rates the attention of the Princeton-Penn affair is attracting. But these two powerhouses probably could put up a good fight against anyone. In addition, Princeton has a 24-game win-

ning streak going, the longest in college football.

This is a tompup with Penn being given a one-point edge, probably on the basis of its 7-7 standoff against Notre Dame, while the boys from Tiger town have been warming up at the expense of lesser lights.

Michigan State, the heir apparent to the No. 1 rating vacated by Tennessee last year, has no sinecure in Texas A & M, but the Spartans are figured to win. Coach Biggie Munn would like to see his charges do their scoring early for a change, though. They're in the habit of teasing the opposition along until the final minutes.

California, the favorite to play host to the big 10 entry in the Rose Bowl, should make hash of Oregon. Stanford, the defending Pacific Coast Conference winner, goes against Oregon State.

Maryland and Georgia Tech, probably the two top teams in the

Southland, face formidable rivals. The Terrapins, banished from the Southern Conference for a year because they played in a bowl game, must get by a strong Georgia outfit, while the Engineers have to deal with Tulane. Duke has an easier assignment against South Carolina.

In the Southwest, the No. 1 contest is an intra-league affair between Texas and Oklahoma. The Sooners are favored, but no matter which way it goes, the game figures to be close.

Besides the Penn-Princeton contest, there is only one other Ivy League game listed. That pits Yale against Columbia, and the Elis should win this on the passing arm of Ed Molloy. Army tangles with Dartmouth and Syracuse meets Cornell in other top attractions.

Walter Johnson pitched 113 shutouts during his 21 years in the American League.

Dandy Doyle is only 16 years old and he's a senior in high school. That just goes to show how smart he is. He makes straight A's in all subjects.

Cal Prexy Blames Grid-happy Alumni

LONG BEACH, Calif. (AP) — President Robert Gordon Sprout of the University of California says that football-minded alumni stand in the way of raising the university's entrance requirements.

He told the California Association of School Administrators Thursday that the university is overtaxing its eight facilities with an enrollment of 35,000. He recommended that students who do not show exceptional promise be encouraged to attend junior and state colleges.

"But football-minded alumni oppose the raising of entrance requirements because of the possible effect on Cal's football fortunes," Dr. Sprout told the convention.

But while he's young he's a football veteran. He has been the quarterback for Temple High for three years. He came to the Wildcats in 1950 from junior high school football. He threw 21 touchdown passes in 11 games.

The next year Traylor pitched 34 touchdown passes in 13 games. This season he has already completed for eight touchdowns in four games.

Coach Ted Dawson, a former University of Texas star, calls him the greatest passer he ever saw but he's more enthusiastic about Doyle's quarterbacking than his throwing. "He's the finest, smartest player I ever coached," says Dawson.
