Crowds Called Political Test

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Dwight D. Eisenhower's appearance here blossomed into one of San Francisco's biggest political rallies in years—and constitutes a formidable challenge to Democrats in the battle for California's 32 electoral votes.

The Republican presidential candidate—despite radio and television coverage—drew a wildly cheering crowd estimated at 29,000 which overflowed the Cow Palace Wednesday night.

The rally climaxed a day of big, enthusiastic crowds for the Eisenhower campaign.

Police estimated 16,000 jammed the railroad station plaza in Sacramento for a whistle-stop.

Police estimated 100,000 cheered the general in downtown San Francisco.

Scores of University of California students were among a train-side crowd estimated by police at 5,000 in Berkeley.

Nearly 5,000 cheered as Eisenhower praised the Navy in a Vallejo park, across the channel from gray warships at Mare Island Navy Yard.
