CHICAGO (U. S. D. A.) — Although the country sent in a third more hogs than expected Friday, the trade easily absorbed them at steady to strong prices. Cattle were unevenly weak to 25 cents higher and sheep were steady.

It was a week of large runs. The most hogs in three months, an estimated 46,500 head, came in but prices held steady to no more than 50 cents lower.

The 40,000 cattle and 1,900 calves (steers) topped at \$18.50 to \$19.00, the most for any week since May. It was a week of large runs. The most hogs in three months, an estimated 46,500 head, came in but prices held steady to no more than 50 cents lower.

Good and choice steers, heifers, and mixed yearlings were the best beef material available, getting \$26.00 to \$32.00. Cows topped at \$18.50, bulls at \$21.50 and vealers at \$34.00.

Only a few head of choice and prime native lambs were around. These took \$26.00 to \$28.25 while utility to average-good grades predominated at \$18.50 to \$24.50. Yearlings were absent and ewes traded downward from \$7.50.

The relative steadiness of wheat was attributed to dry weather in the Southwest, large impoundings of cash grain under the government loan, a let-up in speculative liquidation and favorable interpretation of the way wheat held above seasonal low points in Wednesday's slide-off.
