Fawn Killing Brings Arrest

Two local hunters were arrested last night and cited to a District Court appearance this afternoon for killing a fawn.

Vernon Gillette, 30, of 133 Mortimer, was charged with killing a protected game animal, and Arlie Lewis Barnes, 31, 741 Walnut, with possession of a protected game animal.

The fawn, the men told State Police, was shot in the Swan Lake country by Gillette, who said he killed it, thinking it was a buck.

His car was stopped by a car on game patrol on the OIT road last night, and the officer found blood and hair in the car. He reported the men told him Gillette had shot a deer but when he went to cut its throat, the animal had gotten up and run away.

After taking the names of the men, including Gillette's father, Rollin Gillette, who was in the party, they were allowed to go. But the police officer looked around and found the carcass of a fawn a short distance from where the car had stopped.

He brought the animal in and looked up Gillette and Barnes for further questioning. They then admitted killing the fawn and trying to get it into town, carrying the carcass in the front seat of their car. When their car was stopped, Barnes said, he opened the door and the carcass fell out. He shoved it some distance away from the car.

Klamath Forest Protective Association fire guards yesterday quelled five lightning fires started during a sprinkle of thunderstorms across the Basin area.

Two of the blazes were started on Chase Mountain near Keno, one was on Buck Mountain near Johnson Prairie, and two more were in the Kings Cabin District, not far from the Klamath Reservation line.

None of the fires caused too much damage, but all were considered potentially extremely dangerous because of fire conditions prevailing in the forestlands.

Local Farmers To Get Report

A special crop form has been mailed from the office of Niels L. Nielsen, Portland crop reporting service, and Klamath County Agent C. A. Henderson has announced the forms will be received by about one out of four Klamath County farmers.

He said the forms deserve special attention.

In taking advantage of the service, Henderson said it will give farmers a chance to show what Klamath County and Oregon have done to help meet the nation's need for farm products.

The county agent said the findings of the survey will help the farmer determine what to plant and when to buy and sell. He noted state totals can be used in many ways by local farmers to iron out problems and measure agricultural progress.

The totals will be available for all farmers.

Market Specialist M. D. Thomas, OSC, has called the survey a "dollars and cents" proposition for Oregon farmers. He knows where they stand on production matters.

"Wrong guesses," he said, "can be costly to farmers both in this year's sales and next year's planning."

The final survey, he said, is not a double-check against earlier reports and the individual reports are kept entirely confidential and are used only in arriving at county, state and national totals.
