This is fire prevention week and farmers should keep in mind that electrical fires are on the increase in rural areas. Farmers are particularly cautioned against overloading their wiring. Many kinds of farm electrical equipment put a heavy drain on power systems. The National Fire Protective Association (NFPA) points out that

a fuse is a safety device. When a fuse blows it should never be replaced with a fuse of higher amperage. A blown fuse is a sign of an overload.

The U. S. Department of Agriculture and State agricultural extension services are cooperating with the NFPA in the Fire Prevention Week campaign.

Tobin Predicts 'Stagnation'

LOS ANGELES (U) — Daniel J. Tobin, president of the AFL International Brotherhood of Teamsters, says he looks forward to a period of "stagnation" in industry when the Korean conflict ends.

He told 2,000 delegates at the union's 16th convention Monday that the Korean War is "a war that nobody understands."

The aging teamster chief said he was placing no blame for the war, but described it as one of the most regrettable incidents in U. S. history.

Tobin said the international union's treasury now has 26 million dollars, which it should double in the next five years. The union meets every five years.

At one point Tobin remarked: "I feel like carrying on."

Some delegates interpreted this to mean he might again be a candidate for president, a job he has held for 45 years. His age has been estimated from 77 to 85.

Before the week-long convention opened Monday it was reported that he would step aside in favor of executive vice president Dave Beck, of Seattle, who also is chairman of the Western Conference of Teamsters.

Air Force Orders B-57s

WASHINGTON (U) — The Air Force said Tuesday it has ordered a "substantial number" of B-57 light intruder bombers—a modification of the British Canberra—from the Glenn L. Martin Co.

This was the second order of the kind, part of a continuing program for production of the B-57, an Air Force spokesman said.

The first order was announced in May, 1951. Actual deliveries will begin next year.

The twin-jet night intruder version of the English electric light bomber carries a crew of three—pilot, radio operator and navigator. The plane has a broad, straight wing 64 feet long, a redesigned bomb bay, and is armed with fixed forward-firing guns.

Mac Stays On State Ballot

OLYMPIA (U) — The state supreme court Tuesday denied an application for an order that would have deleted the name of Gen. Douglas MacArthur from the Washington state election ballot.

MacArthur was nominated as a candidate for president of the United States by the Christian Nationalist party. His running mate for vice president is Jack B. Tenney.

Republicans headed by Lou Kessler of Seattle brought the court action to have MacArthur's name removed from the ballot.

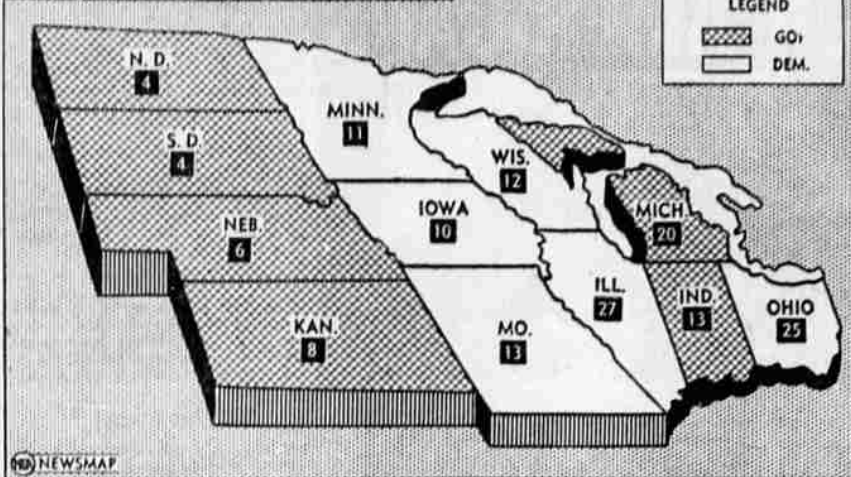
They argued that MacArthur and Tenney were both Republicans and to have their names on the ballot, along with that of the Republican party's candidates—Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, would confuse the voters of the state.

Soon after hearing oral arguments on Kessler's request for a writ of mandamus Chief Justice E. W. Schwelb wrote the word "denied" in the court's record book.

Malnutrition studied

HAZAVILLE, French Equatorial Africa (U) — A milk distribution test in certain Central African territories is being prepared following several inquiries of the diseases of malnutrition in Africa, sponsored by the World Health Organization. Later this year two inter-African conferences will further study the problem of malnutrition.

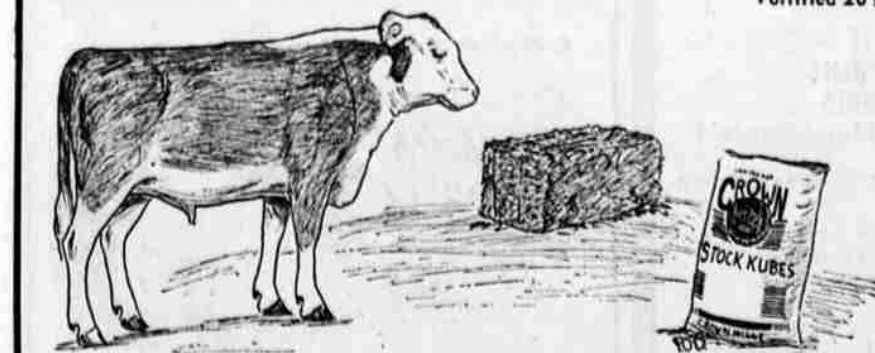

75 OSC Grads Teach Farming

Seventy-five graduates in agriculture from Oregon State college are now vocational agriculture instructors in Oregon high schools, a recent survey shows. Nine 1952 graduates are included on the list.

At the present time, there are 81 Oregon high schools with vocational agriculture departments. An indication of the added importance given to this type of instruction is the establishment this fall of six new departments at Bend, Marshfield, Corbett, Clatskanie, Scio and Siletz high schools.

Working on a 12-month basis, the vocational agriculture instructors plan their subject matter according to the farming needs and practices of the local communities and supervise students in individual farming projects as well as directing the school Future Farmers of America program.

Vocational agriculture teaching training at OSC is under the direction of the agricultural education department.

The session opens at OSC's Memorial Union at 9 a.m., Oct. 10. There will be a registration fee of \$5, Harper says.

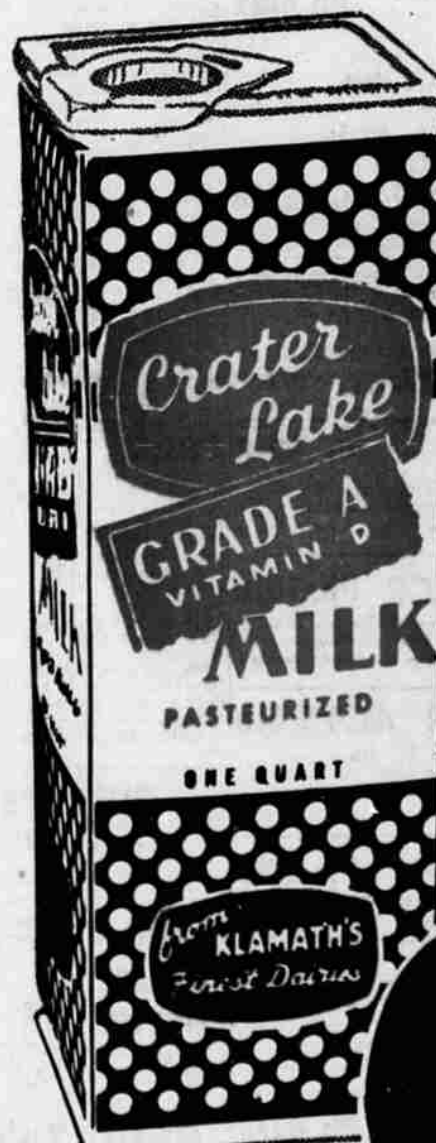
