TEHRAN, Iran (AP) — Iran broke off diplomatic relations with Britain Thursday. It was a grave development in the bitter, 18-month-long dispute over nationalization of the 1 1/2 billion dollar holdings in Iran of Anglo-Iranian Oil Company...
