Chest Gives Support To Scout Group

One of the active organizations who draw on the Klamath County Community Chest for financial support is the Girl Scouts, which in this area boasts 650 girls in its membership.

The movement is world wide in scope, and provides opportunities for girls through several programs for separate age groups from seven through 18 years of age in a program of international friendship and in character building activities.

There are 70 Girl Scout troops in Klamath County, with 105 adult volunteers to direct them—hardly enough. Local Scouting officials report at least 200 adults would be necessary to fulfill an adequate adult leadership program.

The Girl Scouts is partially self-supporting, but without Federal assistance, its activities would have to be drastically cut back.

Here's the way the Girl Scouts organization stands:

Brownie Scouts are from seven to 10 years of age, Intermediate Girl Scouts are from 10 to 14 and Senior Girl Scouts are from 14 to 18 years of age.

A corps of voluntary leaders—mothers and housewives—spend not less than one hour per week with girls, not counting the time spent in preparation and planning for the meetings. For each troop there should be a leader and an assistant, and from three to five interested mothers who act as troop committee members to assist with special activities. Though this is ideal, it hasn't been attained as yet here in Klamath County.

Since this help is all voluntary, an office with a professional worker and an office secretary is maintained to assist and train these volunteers. The office is maintained through Community Chest help.

A group of interested men and women are elected by Nationally Registered Klamath County Girl Scout Adults. They form the Klamath Area Girl Scout Board of Directors who carry on the business of Klamath Area Girl Scouts. They are responsible to the Community Chest Board for the money furnished through that agency for Girl Scouting in this county.

Mrs. Howard Listoe is president of the board, and Mrs. W. W. Dewing is first vice president.

The leaders in Girl Scouting have formed a Leaders' Association, and meet regularly for the purpose of "fellowship, exchange of ideas and further training."

Each troop of Girl Scouts elects a girl member to sit on a Girl Planning Board, which in turn passes along the younger Girl Scouts' ideas on the program.

A Junior Camp Committee evaluates the camp program of the organization and makes recommendations to adult camp committees. In these ways, the Girl Scouting program retains the expressed ideas of the young girls it is working for.

Under the overall Girl Scout program is the very important camping project. Included within its itinerary are the Day Camp, Troop Camp, Trip Camp and Established Camp. This program, officials point out, helps to meet the need of the girls becoming equipped to take care of themselves and to enjoy the out-of-doors.

Established Camp is maintained at Camp Esther Applegate, which is jointly owned by the Girl Scouts and the Camp Fire Girls. It is operated at a cost of \$2 per day to each girl, a fee which does not completely cover the cost but which must be subsidized in order to put camp in reach of every girl. Fifty cents of that amount goes for spending money.

If this year's Community Chest drive is a success, it is hoped that part of the annual cookie sale money can be turned over to the camp fund. During the past two years it has had to go to operating expenses.

Recently the repair and improvement jobs have been accomplished only because of the generosity of interested people.
