BAKER (AP) - Wilbert Steele, convicted of stock theft, will be sentenced Tuesday by Circuit Judge Forrest Hubbard. Steele was accused of shooting a two-year-old heifer belonging to William Widman, butchering it on the spot and selling the hind quarters to a restaurant. He was convicted Friday by a circuit court jury. Fred Phillips, past president of the Oregon Cattlemen's Association and now a member of its policy-making executive board, said that the association will prosecute all stock theft cases to the limit. He said that Blaine Hallock, Baker attorney, has been retained by the association to prosecute cattle theft cases anywhere in the state.

Ike Charges Demos With Poison Lies

By DON WHITEHEAD - Dwight D. Eisenhower, accused of spreading "poison" and "fantastic lies" in an effort to defeat him in the November election. He lashed out at the opposition as he pushed his presidential campaign into New England along the same path taken by President Truman last week.

Despite swirling snow, large crowds gathered to cheer him at every stop. It was the worst weather luck Eisenhower had had since he began campaigning Sept. 1—but the first snow of the season didn't chill the enthusiasm of the crowds.

Peru Urges POW Action

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP) - Peru called on the United Nations General Assembly Monday to consider creation of a commission aimed at breaking the prisoner-of-war deadlock in the Korean truce talks. It was an obvious attempt to surmount refusal of the Communists to accept the results of screening by the unified command which showed thousands of Reds unwilling to go home.

Eisenhower turned bitter criticism against the Democrats in Bridgeport, Conn., where he said there had been charges his election would mean another depression, that he could cut taxes for management but not for the workers, and abolish unions.

He termed these charges lies and said: "The opposition has resorted to the most fantastic lies, and distortions." Earlier at Stamford, he had promised that "every single bit of strength" in the nation would be mustered against another depression. And he said: "We shall never allow such a thing to come again."

Eisenhower and at the same time applaud Republican Sen. Wayne Morse of Oregon for breaking with the GOP presidential nominee. Stevenson said in Houston Saturday he was gratified by Morse's decision to turn against Eisenhower.
