Army Censor On Carpet For Uncensored Writing

SEATTLE (AP)—A former chief censor for the Eighth Army in Korea, already on the military grill for his book on the war there, said Tuesday he has been notified he is facing a further investigation and possibly a new charge.

Lt. Col. Melvin B. Voorhees told reporters he is under orders to report to Fort George Meade, Md., late this week. He said the Second Army command advised him he is to face further inquiry on his action in proceeding with publication of the uncensored book against the orders of a superior officer.

The 50-year-old officer, who has been in the military for 10 years as a reserve officer, was a Washington State newspaperman for 18 years. He was editor of the Tacoma Times when he entered the service in World War II.

He said he had been charged, after a Sixth Army hearing at The Presidio in California, with improper action in failure to submit a manuscript for Army review uncensored after it had been sent to the publisher, and with refusal to carry out an order.

WASHINGTON (AP)—A congressional committee reported today "there is an inference" that political contributions by liquor companies had some connection with the "tapering off" of an antitrust probe of the industry in 1949.

However, the committee said "the evidence is not conclusive," and committee aides declined to tell reporters who drew the inference or on what it was based.

Jersey Men Want Repeal

PORTLAND (AP)—Directors of the Oregon Jersey Cattle Club, angered at what they said was discrimination by the milk control board against the Jersey breed, Monday urged all club members to vote to abolish the present state milk control administration.

The report, issued by a House Judiciary subcommittee that has been investigating the Justice Department, said the political contributions were not made by the companies themselves, but by individuals connected with them, and "There are indications that the contributions were regarded by the individuals who made them as necessary business expenses."
