

Heated Arguments Flare On Milk Control Forum

Charles A. Sprague, publisher of the Salem Statesman, a former Republican governor of Oregon, now attending United Nations sessions in New York as a U.S. alternate delegate, writes in his newspaper today that he won't condemn Senator Morse for deserting Ike and voting for Stevenson.

If last night's Build the Basin milk control forum had been a prize fight it would have had the fans in an uproar from the opening to closing gongs.

Opponents verbally "slugged it out, toe to toe" and when the hour-long debate went off the air the argument continued for some little time.

Senator Morse has acted from conviction. He has made his decision and is prepared to stand by it. I do not propose to read him out of the party for this defection, any more than I propose to let McCarthy et al drive me out of the Republican party.

Question for the Herald and News-KFLW public service forum was: "Should Oregon's milk control regulations be changed as specified in Ballot Measure 32?"

The present milk law controls all phases of the industry from farmer to consumer, sets quotas for production, designates distributors and pegs prices at all levels.

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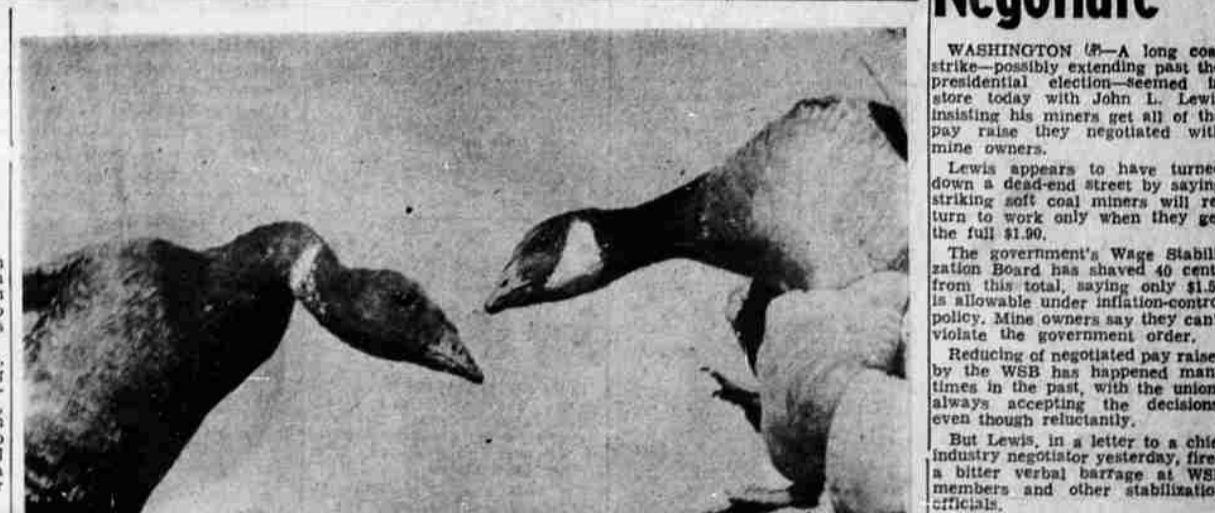
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Long Walkout Feared As Miners Stand Firm
