

## Byrnes Attacks Trumanism In Speech Supporting Ike

CHARLESTON, S.C. (AP)—South Carolina's Gov. James F. Byrnes says the election of Democratic presidential candidate Adlai Stevenson will mean a continuation of "Trumanism" in Washington.

Byrnes made his first major speech here last night in support of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, the Republican nominee. Byrnes has scheduled several other speeches.

At a rally of South Carolinians for Eisenhower, Byrnes said if Stevenson is elected, "he will be under such obligations to Truman

that he will have to comply with Truman's requests."

Byrnes, former secretary of state, war mobilizer and member of the Supreme Court, said "Trumanism" is the worst enemy of the people have given a mandate to continue Trumanism."

Byrnes said Eisenhower "can do more than any other man to promote peace in the world and restore confidence in government."

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—The transport A. E. Anderson docks today from the Far East with 1,470 Army and Air Force personnel, 337 from the Navy and Marines and 175 civilians.

Two transports, the Marine Serpent and Gen. Nelson M. Walker, arrived yesterday carrying 3,766 servicemen, most of them combat veterans of Korea.

The Sgt. Howard E. Woodford, with 596 military personnel from the Canal Zone, also docked yesterday.

WITH 7th DIVISION, Korea (AP)—Lt. Col. William H. Isbell, "the old colonel" who died dramatically on Triangle Hill while leading an infantry charge, will be recommended for the Medal of Honor.

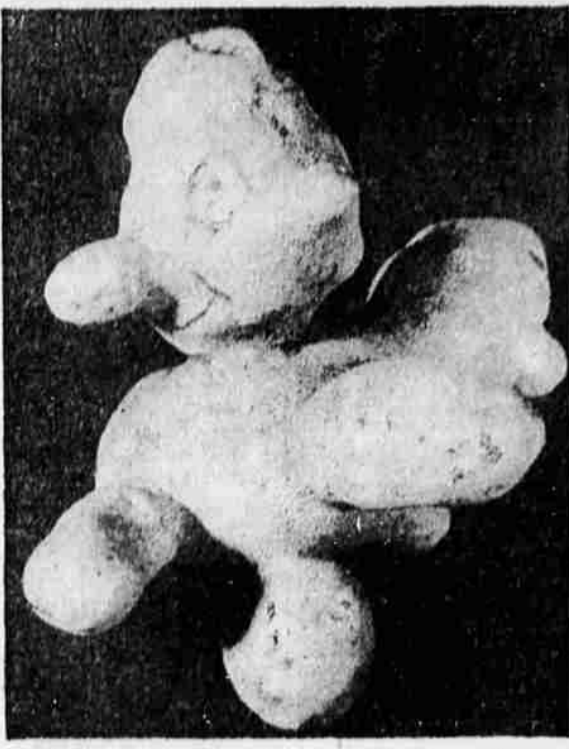
U. S. 7th Division headquarters today said its artillery section was drafting the citation.

Isbell, of Gambrills, Md., was called the "old colonel" by young infantrymen although he was only 45. He had worked his way up the steep slope through intense Chinese Red shellfire to find whether his artillery could be used more effectively.

He found infantrymen pinned down 50 yards short of the crest, walked to the top and called upon them to follow. A Communist dynamite blast killed him.

## Walkout Cuts Miners Pay

WASHINGTON (AP)—It won't be long before strike idleness costs coal miners as much money as they would gain from the disputed 40-cent daily pay raise in an entire year.

Miners average between 180 and 200 days of work a year. So the 40 cents a day would amount to about \$75 or \$80 per man in a year's time.

Their average earnings run in the neighborhood of \$20 a day. So four days lost wages about equals the 40 cents daily raise on a year's basis.

However, it is often true in the coal industry that days lost during strikes are worked later in the year. This is because the industry normally turns out all the coal that is needed without keeping the miners steadily employed.

**Admiral Corp. To Back Sheen**  
NEW YORK (AP)—Bishop Fulton J. Sheen's television series, "Life Is Worth Living," has won million-dollar backing.

The Admiral Corp. announced last night it will sponsor the 26-week TV series starting Nov. 18 over a score of more Dumont TV network outlets.

Dumont said the million paid by Admiral TV and radio firm, less expenses, will go to Mission Humanity, Inc., of which the Roman Catholic bishop is national director. Mission Humanity is a member of the voluntary agencies of the United Nations and aids hospitals and other institutions throughout the world.

## Clark Reverses Rotation Plan

TOKYO (AP)—Gen. Mark Clark under Pentagon pressure Wednesday reversed an order requiring battle front troops to stay in the line 9 1/2 months before they are eligible for rotation home. The time remains at nine months, or 36 points under the Army's system.

But Clark said rear area troops in Korea and those in Japan would have to serve longer than previously because of a lag in replacements. No specific point quota was announced. Clark earlier had set it at 38.

Clark's statement was issued after Secretary of Defense Lovett said in Washington the Pentagon had overruled Clark's Sept. 17 order requiring 38 instead of 36 points for rotation.

The Army gives four points a month for time in the battle line. It gives three points monthly to troops serving immediately behind the front and two points a month

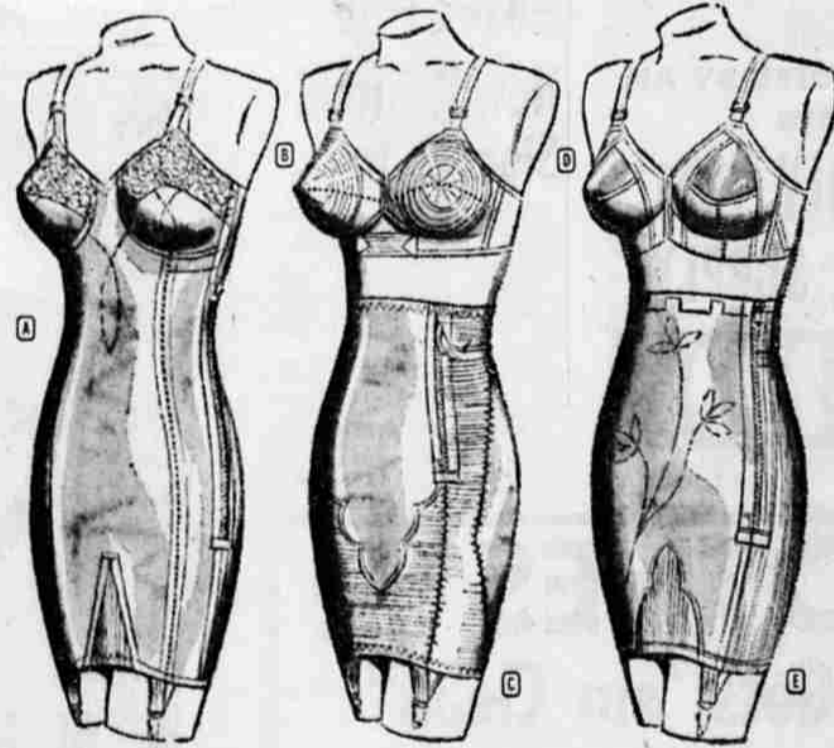
