Nag Show Opens Saturday

HARRISBURG (AP) — With the opening of the Pennsylvania National Horse Show tomorrow this state capital city becomes the nation's equine center for two weeks. The seven-day show brings together more than 600 of the top exhibition animals of America and four foreign nations competing for trophies and more than \$35,000 in cash prizes. Highlighting the show, which runs through Nov. 1 with no Sunday performance, is the international competition between jumping teams from the United States, Canada, France, Ireland and Mexico.

AUCTION
A week following the close of the seventh annual Pennsylvania national is the standardized horse sale, one of the nation's largest auctions of trotters and pacers. More than a million dollars in harness horses were purchased here during last year's sale. The standardized sale will be held in the huge state farm show arena, also the site of the Pennsylvania national, from Nov. 10 through Nov. 15. All five international jumping teams took their workouts yesterday in the farm show arena. Team captains pronounced all their mounts in top competition.

JUMPERS
Pierre d'Orsola, who took top individual honors in Olympic jumping events, announced he would again ride Ali Baba, his winning mount at Helsinki. The other four teams, including America's third-place winner at Helsinki, all appeared here last year and at the later shows at New York's Madison Square Garden and Toronto's Royal Winter Fair. The crack Mexican Army team, captained by Gen. Humberto Mariles, the 1948 Olympic king who was ill during the Helsinki jumping, is expected to be one of the top contenders. Mariles will ride a new mount, Petrolario.

KU Wildcats Drub Merrill

The Klamath Union High School Wildcats drubbed Merrill, 46-14, yesterday on the losers' field. Merrill became the 'Cats' third Klamath County League victim. Using a split-T, the Vandals have dumped North Dakota State and Utah State and pushed Oregon around before losing. The other loss was to Washington, the tie with Utah. Two of the Broncos' defeats — to Kansas and Tulane — were to split-T outfits. Coach Babe Gurman's Vandals, Thursday night worked out under the lights in Kezar Stadium, scene of Friday night's game.

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College All-Stars, Pros Mix

CHICAGO (AP) — A front-line trio averaging 6 feet 9 inches in height will be the collegians' hope tonight in stopping George Mikan in the 13th annual all-star basketball classic. The game, sponsored by the Chicago Herald-American, is expected to attract a capacity 18,000 fans at Chicago Stadium.

The hand-picked college squad tangles with the professional championship Minneapolis Lakers led by the giant Mikan. The pros and collegians have each gained six victories to deadlock the series but the campus heroes have been unable to win for the last three years. Phog Allen, veteran University of Kansas coach and head man of the all-stars, will start a front line of Mark Workman of West Virginia and Don Meineke of Dayton at forwards, and Ray Felix of Long Island U. at center.
