### Washington Mystery Man Indicted By Grand Jury

WASHINGTON (AP) — A federal grand jury Thursday indicted Henry W. (The Dutchman) Grunewald, shadowy man-about-town, Washington, on 22 charges of contempt of Congress.

Grunewald's name fitted in and out of the sensation-packed hearings last year by a House committee investigating tax frauds.

Grunewald finally was called as a witness last January, but declined to answer any questions.

About all the investigators got out of him in five sessions was the statement: "I was born in 1892."

He declined on advice of counsel to say where he was born or talk about anything involving him since that date.

Thursday's indictment charged among other things that Grunewald refused to tell the House Ways and Means subcommittee, headed by Rep. King (D-Calif.) what officials of the Internal Revenue Bureau he knew, and whether he had ever discussed any tax cases pending

in that bureau.

Grunewald, if convicted on each count of the indictment, would be subject to maximum penalties of 22 years in prison or \$22,000 fine, or both.

The matter the King committee particularly wanted to explore with Grunewald was the story told by Abraham Teitelbaum, Chicago lawyer and one time counsel for Capone interests.

Teitelbaum swore to the investigators that an attempt was made to shake him down for \$500,000 under a threat that he would have bad tax troubles if he didn't pay the sum.

Teitelbaum said Frank Nathan, a Pittsburgh promoter, and Bert K. Naster, a Florida business man, sought the money and told him they were in cahoots with a group of Washington officials who looked for "soft touches."

Teitelbaum said too that he received a telephone call from a

man who identified himself as "Mr. Watson" and who told him he had better "play along" with Nathan and Naster. He said this man had a guttural voice.

Nathan and Naster took the witness chair and denied there was any truth in Teitelbaum's story.

The various officials named in there was any clique preying on "soft touches."

Testimony was developed that T. Lamar Caudle, assistant attorney general since fired, exclaimed when he heard the story of the guttural-voiced telephone call:

"That must have been The Dutchman."

### Cordon Calls Adlai Comic

HERMISTON (AP) — Sen. Guy Cordon (R-Ore) said here Wednesday night the present administration "either doesn't know how to win the Korean War or is too cowardly to try."

Cordon, introduced by William Hansen, Umatilla County Republican Committee chairman, as the "only Republican senator from Oregon," addressed a dinner meeting of 120. Hansen's reference was to the decision of Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore) to vote for Gov. Adlai Stevenson for president.

"Never before have I felt fear for my country, including two world wars, but now we are facing the problem of mortgaging the future of our children, their children and children's children," Cordon said.

He called Stevenson "the greatest comedian since Charlie Chaplin."

Cordon endorsed Sam Cook, Republican candidate for Second District congressman, and other GOP

office seekers. He is on a two-day tour of Umatilla County.
