## Mounties Visit Hollywood To Give Filmdom Big Show

**HOLLYWOOD (AP) —** Hollywood, which has made many movies about the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, now has a chance to see the Mounties up close.  
 An expert riding team from the famous law enforcement body is currently playing the Los Angeles Horse Show. Between performance, the Mounties have had a chance to tour the studio and see how movies are made.  
 I had a chat with the leader of the group, Inspector A. S. McNeil, from the headquarters at Regina, Sask. A tall, friendly man, he told me there is a considerable difference between the Mounties of the movies and those in real life.  
 "There have been some fine pictures about the service," he began. "But most of them have certain things that any Mountie would know were false. There is one thing that always rankles me. The mountie in the movies is generally shown with long sideburns and hair that looks like a beaver hat. The fact is that we require regular haircuts, even in the North Country. Most Mounties have a crew cut."  
 The inspector brought out a disbelieving fact: few Mounties ride horses any more. "You'll find them on horseback in the national parks," he explained. "Also, some patrol near the Parliament Building and other points of interest so the tourist won't be disappointed."  
 "But otherwise we use the most modern of equipment. We have two and three-way radio. We also have the most advanced crime laboratories, since we are the equivalent of the FBI in the United States. Even in the North Country Mounties don't use horses. They have dog sleds."  
 The typical Hollywood movie about the Mounties shows the intrepid hero tracking the criminal hundreds of miles into the wilds. McNeil commented that there have been such instances in the 75-year history of the force.  
 "But nowadays we never send one man on a mission," he added. "The men generally go out in pairs. Sometimes three men are sent. But it has been found that does not work as well. Two of the men usually team up against the other on long trips."  
 Not all of the Mounties work in tracking down criminals. They do everything from undercover anti-Communist work in big factories to delivering babies in frontier villages.  
 Oh, yes, that's sheer nonsense.

## Barkley On Air For Adlai

**JERSEY CITY, N.J. (AP) —** Vice President Alben W. Barkley described Gov. Adlai E. Stevenson as a man of "culture, refinement and education" in a homey talk Thursday night to a nationwide radio and television audience.  
 Seated in an easy chair in a local hotel, the elderly Barkley compared the Democratic presidential nominee to Woodrow Wilson, saying both men worked for the safety and peace of the world.  
 Barkley's radio and television talk on "Stevenson the Man" was almost entirely free of campaign issues. The only reference to any of the issues came in his mention of Sen. Wayne D. Morse (R-Ore.) who he said had come out for Stevenson because "Eisenhower was surrounded by reactionary forces."  
 Referring to criticisms of Stevenson for his sense of humor, the 74-year-old vice president said that "a sense of humor is an asset."  
 At another point in his half-hour talk, Barkley said Stevenson does not believe that a third world war with Russia is inevitable.  
 If Stevenson is elected, he added, he "will devote himself to a greater effort to promote peace for all mankind."
