Chase Family Has Reunion

A recent Chase family reunion here brought together members of one of the most illustrious clans in the West.

The reunion honored the memory of George L. Chase, a sturdy pioneer who blazed many Oregon trails. During the Modoc War, Chase had charge of transportation of troops and supplies for the government forces. After the war, he entered the stage business at Carson City, Nev.

In 1878, he came to Oregon and had a stage running from Cole's Station to Rocky Point and later from Jacksonville to Klamath Falls then known as Linkville.

In 1882, Chase was wed to Anne Little, Jacksonville, daughter of one of the early settlers of Jackson County. Nine children were born to the Chases and reared on their ranch, known popularly as "the old Chase Station."
