 Ever since O'Brien has been making one round trip daily between the two cities, he claims U. S. citizenship but the U. S. consulate here says he is Hungarian.
 Immigration authorities are keeping a close eye on O'Brien. The Lee Hong may be in drydock a month.

Japs Form Anti-Red Group

TOKYO (AP) — The nucleus of an underground anti-Communist resistance organization aimed at possible Soviet invaders was formed in Tokyo last month and is growing rapidly.
 It is called the National Martyrs Youth Corps.
 Existence of the right-wing group was disclosed when a corps of National Martyrs beat up Communist squatters at the Foreign Office. The Reds had been forcefully demanding passport visas to attend the Communist-sponsored Asia and Pacific "Peace" Conference in Peiping.
 Saburo Gotokuji, secretary-general of the Patriotic Youth Volunteers Committee of which the youth corps is a part, said in an interview. "It's high time we prepared for a Red invasion."
 "We are going to fight the Japanese Communists openly now," he said, "and underground if the Russians should come."
 While the organization says its aim is to "reconstruct Japan," its immediate purpose is to prepare an underground combat network in case of invasion.
 Gotokuji said the number of members has increased in less than a month to 500 in Tokyo and 3,000 throughout Japan.
 Asked about the use of violence in his anti-Red campaign, Gotokuji said it was "out of bounds and entirely unnecessary."
 The youth corps leader contended that intense physical training, including judo, fencing and boxing, for all his corpsmen was merely for self-defense purposes and to create "a healthy spirit in a healthy body."

Taloo Reports On Life In Autobiography

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Tallulah's back in town!
 Tallulah who? Hankhead, you dope. The Alabama Toriade is again facing the film cameras after seven years in other pursuits. This time she's emoting for "Main Street to Broadway," the co-operative venture to benefit the legit theater.
 Since Taloo is the reporter's delight in producing quotes, I dropped in to see her at work. But alas, she was too wrapped up in emulating a double fantasy. In the first sequence, she played a wicked woman who poisoned six people, including herself. In the second, she was a demure housewife (this required real acting for Taloo).
 All this labor consumed her time and she was not able to chit-chat. However, she had presented me with a copy of her new autobiography, inscribed "with love" (a standard inscription, I'm sure). So instead of querying her, I got my answers from her book.
 I was interested in her previous adventures in Hollywood. I came across her confession about her film career in the early '30s:
 "I was no great shakes. I was victimized by the mechanics of the whole business. In Hollywood you do nothing for yourself. You don't even apply your own make-up. You are awakened, taken to the studio, made up. I was a set-up for that formula. You play your roles in snips and driplets, harassed by delays, interruptions and stupidities."
 She wrote of her invitation to a "strictly informal" dinner given by Joan Crawford. Taloo arrived in slacks to find la Crawford decked out as if she were attending the Metropolitan Opera.
 Miss Crawford promised her a "surprise dinner companion." He was Jackie Cooper, 8.
 Some time later, Walter Wanger arranged a blind date for Tallulah. Her escort turned out to be Gary Cooper, the "strong silent type."
 "Silent is right," she adds. "Gary never opened his trap throughout the evening."
 The next day a columnist reported the pair engaged. This prompted Reuters to cable from England: "Confirm engagement to Gary Cooper." Tallulah cabled back: "You have it all wrong. Am engaged to Jackie Cooper."
 She says that one London daily

headlined: "Tallulah engaged to John Cooper." The paper even dragged out a morgue photo of a John Cooper, a retired golf pro.
 Her engagement to Ronald Colman, a man she had not yet met, was later reported.
 Her first movie career was something of a fiasco. But she returned 13 years later and won the New York Critics Award for her performance in "Lifeboat."
 "At last I had licked the screen, a screen which had six times betrayed me," she writes. "Did I get an Academy Oscar? No! The people who vote in that free-for-all know on which side their crepes
