

Maryland Junior Surrenders on Bribe Charge

Scarbath, 2 Others Involved

WASHINGTON (AP)—A municipal judge Thursday put off until Nov. 29 hearing of an extradition claim by the state of Maryland against a University of Maryland student charged with trying to fix a football game.

Government attorneys argued for the delay in order to give Maryland authorities time to prepare extradition papers.

Maryland officials want the student, Louis Leonard Glickfield, to answer charges he tried to bribe a Maryland football star to fix a game last Saturday.

Glickfield did not say a word during the brief hearing before Judge Nadine L. Gallagher.

The 21-year-old junior from Hyattsville, Md., surrendered to police here Wednesday night and then was freed in \$1,000 bail.

The youth was represented at the hearing by attorney Charles E. Ford of Washington.

A Prince Georges County, Md., warrant charges Glickfield with attempting to bribe Tom Cosgrove of Philadelphia, senior and first-string offensive center on Maryland's football team. Glickfield was arrested in Washington as a fugitive from that charge. Atty. Ford made it clear he will fight extradition.

THREE OFFERS

University officials at College Park, Md., a suburb of Washington, said three bribe offers were made to hold down the score against Louisiana State University in last Saturday's game. They said the other players who told of being approached—not mentioned in the warrant—were quarterback Jack Scarbath of Baltimore, a top contender for All-America honors, and Frank Navarro of White Plains, N.Y., senior first-string offensive guard.

According to signed statements by the three players, the student approached them individually and offered them a total of \$1,500 to play in Maryland's split-T offense. He said he was offered \$1,000. Navarro said he was offered \$400. Scarbath \$100.

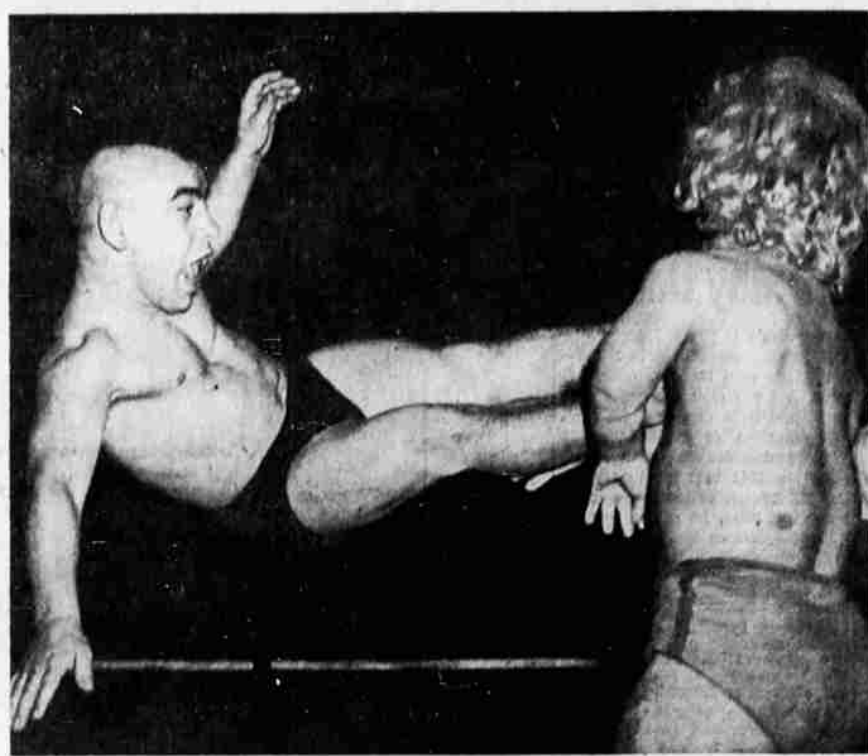
Maryland President H. C. Byrd said Coach Jim Tatum notified him last Friday, the day before the game, that the three players had reported being offered bribes.

Dr. Byrd said he wanted to announce it immediately, but was dissuaded by police who hoped to catch the alleged offender in the act "and perhaps find out if any gambling ring was behind him."

LEAVE ALONE

"At any rate," Dr. Byrd said, "this should emphasize to gamblers they had better leave college football players alone."

Tatum said that, before playing Louisiana State, all his players dressed for the game were asked to sign affidavits stating whether or not they had been approached with any bribe offers. All signed that they had not been, except Scarbath, Cosgrove and Navarro.

Tor Yamato Whips Dusette But Beaver, Mecera Grab Spotlight

The wrestling midgets — Little Beaver in particular — stole the show last night at the Armory as expected. But Lulu (Lou) Mecera was close second in his loss to Jack (Hatchiman) Terry.

Tor Yamato whipped Georges Dusette with the sleeper hold in less than 21 minutes in the main event, but it's the sensational little Indian fans are talking about today.

The small Quebec, Can., wrestler had most of the fans in the capacity house standing when he won on the warpath past the midway point in the half-hour bout to win the decision for himself and his partner, Tuffy McCra.

McCra, who showed an effective headlock, fell victim to the combined attack of Fuzzy Cupid and Tom Thumb. That's what touched off Beaver's act.

DROPKICKS

The fabulous little showman, fast as lightning and twice as bright, rushed from his corner to throw into high gear his dropkicks.

He knocked both Cupid and Thumb out of the ring with his first two boots, then decked them one after another as quickly as they got up after their return to the rings.

Grocery with the barefoot wallops to his chin, Fuzzy Cupid finally stayed down and it was a simple matter for Little Beaver to press him to the mat for the fall.

Cupid and Thumb worked as a team, using illegal tactics to offset Beaver's speed and mat brilliance. They handed both Beaver and Mc-

Cra a handful of lumps during the bout but didn't figure on Beaver's blinding speed that paid off in the clutch.

FIFTH TIME

It was the fifth straight time the mat midgets have scored a smash hit here. Wrestling customers will welcome them back anytime.

Mecera, a handsome Italian with a lot of mat know-how, traded Terry bump for bump in the second bout on the program but fell into the ex-Army judo instructor's luluzy hold just when it looked like (Mecera) had victory all wrapped up.

Terry, who infuriated the fans by holding the show up when he refused to appear in the opener—arguing that his battle royal victory last week entitled him to main event billing—felt Mecera's rocking right hand for every hatchet blow he Terry dished out.

Terry finally tossed Mecera out of the ring and twice knocked him back when the Italian tried to get back in playing territory.

SHOULDER BUTT

But Mecera crossed him up with a shoulder butt and followed with a barrage of blows that had the Hatchiman reeling. One wallop

knocked Terry out of the ring. When judo Jack climbed back on the ring apron, Mecera decked Referee Buck Davidson who moved in to intercede for Terry, and grabbed Terry in an attempt to flip him back onto the canvas. But Terry got the sleeper and it was all over.

It was by far the most action-filled bout of the evening—with the exception of the tag tiff between the small men—and far outshone Tony Ross' win over Jack Britton in the opener and Yamato's victory over Dusette.

Dusette found the full Nelson but Yamato ran for the ropes. When Davidson broke the two wrestlers, the Jap whacked Dusette with a hatchet-blow across the side of the head. Dusette, stunned and reeling, was an easy mark for Yamato's sleeper. The bout, changed to a finish, one-fall affair on Yamato's request, lasted 20 minutes, 20 seconds.

Ross won with the back-breaker over Britton in 14:50.

Mack Lillard announced that Mr. Sakata, sensational Japanese wrestling star who appeared here last season, had been signed for an appearance next Wednesday "against some outstanding opponent."
