Hayden Positon Better After Commie Declaration

 HOLLYWOOD (AP)—What happens to an actor's career after he confesses he had been a Communist? Some actors have fallen to obscurity, others have managed to continue their careers. One of the latter is Sterling Hayden, the tall, rugged ex-convict who testified last year in Washington that he had been a member of the Communist party for six months in 1946.

Hayden has always been free to speak his mind, so I directed some pointed questions at him:

How did the Washington headlines affect his career immediately afterward?

"If anything, I was in a better position than I was before," he replied. "Before I had testified, there was a cloud over my name, a sort of uncertainty about whether I was 'safe' or not. Producers were naturally afraid to cast me. Afterward, everything was out in the open.

"As to the immediate reaction, I don't know. Nobody wanted to hire me, because they didn't know how public opinion would turn. I never heard of any producers who said they would not hire me. There may have been some, but my agent didn't tell me of any."

How did the situation break?

"I went to Y. Frank Freeman (head of Paramount, where he had previously been under contract) and told him I needed a job. After I left, he called the talent department and then called me. He said the only part he could offer me was as a heavy in an adventure picture. He said it would be less money than I had been getting, but if I wanted the job, I could have it. I took it."

Since then he has worked almost steadily. He has made eight pictures in a row, including "The Election Weather May Be Good."

Greenbacker Stays Cool

SEATTLE (AP)—The nation's first 1952 nominee or president isn't even getting on the ballot in his home state.

The "candidate nobody knows" is Frederick C. Proehl, an unassuming Seattle neighborhood grocer and presidential nominee of the Greenback party. He hasn't even asked for a vote.

Like two better-known candidates for the presidency, the former Minnesotan did not seek the nomination. He was tending quietly to his groceries when it was thrust upon him last November.

"It was all a surprise to me," he observed from behind his counter. "National headquarters just wrote me I had been chosen by referendum."

He didn't get on the ballot in Washington State because the Greenback party did not hold any convention.

Proehl said he figures he was nominated because of the speeches he used to make in Minnesota. "That's all, and both by invitation."

When he talks Greenback party doctrine, it portrays banksters as the villains in the national act. "They would issue currency instead, which could be retired as bonds are now—but without interest payments."

New Policy For Services

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Defense Department has instructed the combat services to announce promptly the names of service men killed or hurt in accidents outside military installations in the United States.

A directive was issued by Defense Secretary Lovett Oct. 22 and made public Wednesday night.

Present practice is to withhold the names of accident victims until their next of kin have been notified.

Its language falls a little short of a positive order. In that it states that the names and addresses of military personnel involved in accidents "should be" released immediately upon identification.

The usual form of a directive military order would substitute "shall" for should.

Promotion Due General Dean

WASHINGTON (AP)—Maj. Gen. William F. Dean, a prisoner of the Communists in Korea for more than two years, has been recommended for a promotion.

Army Secretary Frank Pace Jr. announced Wednesday that Dean was among 24 Army general officers recommended for elevation to the permanent grade of major general in the regular Army. Dean's rank of major general has been a temporary one.

Dean was captured by the enemy July 21, 1950, while commanding the 24th Infantry Division in the bitter fighting around Taejon, Korea.

He has been awarded the Medal of Honor for his leadership and gallantry during that time.
