

Ike Reaffirms Personal Independence; Calls Demo Campaign Gigantic Smear

EN ROUTE WITH Eisenhower—Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower headed for Chicago by plane today after three hard-driving days in New York where he said, in a climactic speech, the Democrats are trying to destroy him with a super-smear.

"They have made wild charges spread the rumors, and played fast and loose with the truth," he said.

"They are determined to destroy me; to destroy my life-long friendships, my reputation, my spirit. This has been some campaign! It has been shocking."

Eisenhower hurled these charges last night at a rip-roaring GOP rally in Madison Square Garden.

The Democrats turned their fire when they failed to prevent the unification he claims has taken place in the Republican party. He said he wasn't greatly perturbed on any personal basis.

Recalling that the late Nazi propagandists, Joseph Goebbels and Julius Streicher, and more recently, the Russian "poison pen artists" have attacked him, the general grinned:

"I have been worked over by experts."

He closed by reasserting: "I have made no deals in this campaign."

"No one has a claim on me. No one has a promise from me. No one has captured me. I am my own man."

The great arena was jammed. Edward Miller, head of the security forces for the building, fixed the attendance at 23,000.

Gov. Adlai Stevenson, the Democratic candidate, also filled the hall two nights earlier. Which of the two drew greater attendance could not be determined, since there were unknown numbers of standees to hear both candidates.

This was Eisenhower's blue chip effort in the New York area.

He spent three days this week in or near New York City, campaigning from morning until at night. He worked a 12-hour schedule and sometimes longer. And he threw his full energy into the drive.

It all came to a colorful, noisy, and well-staged climax in the Garden.

For more than four hours before Eisenhower appeared, movie stars, political leaders—and more than 20 women from various walks of life—paraded across the stage.

Finally, Eisenhower went before the television cameras, accompanied by a deafening roar of applause, and began his speech.

He quickly hit one of his main themes, recalling that some Democrats wanted him to be the party candidate in 1948.

That gave him the opportunity to say the opposition wanted him "to be the man to defend governmental corruption, excuse their coddling of Communists, and apologize for their vacillating policies."

He asked: "How could they dare think I was their man?"

Yet, Eisenhower said, he is the same man now as he was four years ago. He said he has not changed, and he is nobody's "captive."

This apparently was a reply to Stevenson's claim that the general "swallowed" Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio "hook, line and sinker."

Eisenhower said he came home to run for president for three reasons—"many millions of Americans wanted me to...I wanted to work for peace. It remains my conviction that neither the present administration nor any candidate committed to it can do the job either at home or abroad that America will be called upon to do in the next four years."

Eisenhower said it is the Democrats, not he, who have changed. "Because they could not exploit me, they are determined to destroy me," he declared.

In speaking, Eisenhower passed over portions of his written text, apparently when he began running behind his allotted 30-minute TV time. One part deleted read: "Dober" responsible correspondents who report political campaigns year after year have written that our opponents in this election have reached a record low in mud-slinging, distortion, vilification and character assassination."

He listed the things he said the American people want—lower taxes, higher prosperity for all income groups, an effort by "the best minds of America" to bring

an honorable end to the war in Korea.

Eisenhower said that to achieve these things, unity in the United States is essential. His first effort, he went on, was to achieve unity in the Republican party. And, again hitting back at Democratic accusations, he said:

"No single one of them (his Republican backers) thought it necessary to tell me that unity must never be bought at the cost of principle."

Eisenhower was introduced by Gov. Thomas E. Dewey, who brought round after round of applause, especially to his claim that the Truman administration "is so rotten it is about to collapse."

Dewey accused Truman of throwing "dead cats, rotten eggs and tomatoes" at Eisenhower.
