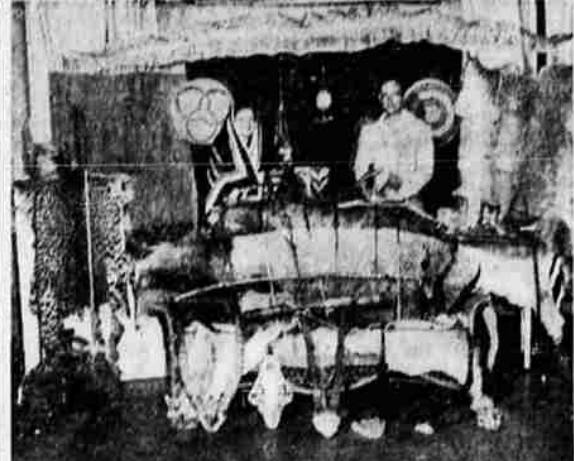

Gls Hear Little Of Campaign

TOKYO (AP)—The U. S. presidential candidates are talking quite a bit about the Korean War and the frontline soldier—but the American fighting men seldom get to hear or read much of it. Many troops in the lines have never heard the voices of the non-commissioned Dwight D. Eisenhower and Democrat Adlai Stevenson. And many have not read much of what they have said.

Despite thorough coverage of the campaign by the Armed Services Radio and its network of stations in Korea, Marines and infantrymen haven't had a chance to hear it. There are few radios at the front. Airmen in rear area fields and sailors are better posted. There is about one radio to every 20 men in rear areas.

Kaiser May Limit Output

SPOKANE (AP)—The Kaiser Aluminum and Chemical Corp. said Wednesday it may have to shut down another production pipeline at its Mead plant here because of the latest power curtailment order.

Its eight production units, each of which has already closed three times a month, are producing about 1.5 million pounds of pig aluminum.

The Defense Electric Power Administration announced Wednesday that effective Nov. 17 consumers with firm power contracts will be limited to 90 per cent of the electricity they used at the same time last year because of the water shortage.

Newspapers Back Ike

NEW YORK (AP)—Editor and Publisher reports a new survey shows that four U. S. newspapers are supporting Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower for every one supporting Gov. Adlai E. Stevenson.

The trade magazine said Thursday night its final pre-election poll of 1,350 daily newspapers showed 67.34 per cent of them—with 80.24 per cent of the total daily circulation—are supporting the Republican presidential candidate.

The Democratic candidate is backed by 14.52 per cent of the dailies—with 10.88 per cent of the total circulation.

No declaration for either candidate has been made by 18.14 per cent of the dailies. The survey was completed Oct. 27.

Editor and Publisher reported 933 dailies in 48 states for Eisenhower and 201 dailies in 39 states for Stevenson.

The nine states without daily newspaper editorial support for Stevenson are Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Utah and Vermont.

Pre-Stevenson dailies outnumber pro-Eisenhower dailies in only three states—Georgia, Kentucky, and South Carolina.

The 1,385 dailies poll represents 78 per cent of the 1,773 dailies in the country.

Race Close Says Bookie

LONDON (AP)—A big London bookie rated the American presidential election a neck-and-neck race Friday.

Bookmaker Douglas "Always Pays" Stuart set his odds at 4 to 3 and pick your candidate—that is you put up five dollars to win four.

But he's still coming pretty fast, his spokesman said, "with not the slightest sign of a leaning toward either candidate."

New Taxman For Northwest

WASHINGTON (AP)—A 30-year veteran of the Internal Revenue Department will head the new Seattle federal tax district embracing Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana and Alaska.

Secretary of the Treasury Snyder Wednesday announced the appointment of Dallas A. Sims, 55, now Internal Revenue agent at Oklahoma City, as commissioner of the recently created district.

Sims, four directors of revenue named to head state tax collection areas, and five assistant district commissioners, will be installed Friday in ceremonies at the University of Washington.

State directors to take office along with Sims will be William E. Frank, who will have charge of the Seattle office and also handle Alaska tax collections; Ralph C. Granquist, Portland; Calvin E. Wright, Boise and Thomas M. Robinson, Helena.

Assistant district commissioners who will be under Sims in the Seattle headquarters are Frank J. Healy, collections; Seth R. Stocklin, audit; Roy C. Basham, intelligence; Joseph B. Harbacher, appeals and tobacco tax collection; and Harold M. Charlton, a assistant for administration will be named later.

Egypt Protests Cash to Jews

CAIRO, Egypt (AP)—Premier Mahmoud Naguib announced last night that Egypt has handed the West German government a note formally protesting a recent agreement to pay Israel reparations for Nazi persecutions of Jews.

Naguib handed the note to the new German ambassador, Guenther Pawellek, shortly after the seven-nation Arab League's Political Committee held an emergency meeting here to work out joint action against the payments to Israel. The Arabs contend the money should go to the 900,000 Arab refugees of the Palestine War.

MANILA (AP)—The U. S. Air Force Friday said a radio signal had been intercepted that may have come from the B-29 weather plane missing since Clark Field.

A spokesman at Sand Field added "the signal was too weak for positive identification."

Aircraft from the Philippines and Guam are searching a wide area of the Pacific east of the Philippines where the giant plane was believed to have been downed by a typhoon. The Air Force said 10 crewmen were missing. It earlier had announced that 15 were aboard.
