**Wife Admits Giving Info**  
 LOS ANGELES (AP)—Mrs. James A. Van Fleet, wife of the U. S. Eighth Army commander in Korea, says she "didn't want to see Ike defeated by lies," so she gave the GOP presidential nominee permission to use a letter her husband wrote about South Korean forces.

The Gen. Van Fleet letter dated Oct. 10, was addressed to Maj. Gen. Orlando C. Mood, Van Fleet's ex-chief of staff now in Washington, with a copy to Mrs. Van Fleet. The letter said the general had been unable to win approval of his plan to increase the strength of the South Korean forces by two divisions or more.

Upon her arrival here Friday, Mrs. Van Fleet declared: "Ike had that letter for five days but he wouldn't use it until he talked with me personally. He told me, 'I wouldn't want to hurt Van for anything in the world.'"  
 Mrs. Van Fleet said she gave us the letter.

In Walter Reed hospital in Washington, Gen. Mood said Friday he regarded his correspondence with Van Fleet as "personal and confidential."
