'Sucker' Gets Morse Refund

EUGENE (U) — A Eugene lumberman, who described himself earlier as a "sucker" for contributing money to expenses of Sen. Wayne L. Morse (R-Ore.), disclosed Saturday that Morse had returned the \$1,200.

The lumberman, George Owen, who was bitter over Morse's bolt from the Republican ticket, said Morse sent a letter that said in part:

"In view of your obvious regret... I am enclosing a check for \$1,200... In politics I have come to learn that true friends are those who stand with you even when they believe you to be wrong on some issues. I am sorry that your friendship for me was not as deep as you had caused me to believe. With best wishes always..."

Owen, who said he made the \$1,200 contribution some time ago to defray Morse's printing expenses, said, "I was never more surprised or more pleased over receiving money. I feel now that I haven't been played for a sucker."

Other Republicans, including Gov. Douglas McKay, have criticized Morse for announcing that he could not support the Eisenhower-Nixon ticket. Morse, since has spoken in behalf of Gov. Adlai Stevenson of Illinois, the Democratic nominee for President.

LOGGER KILLED

ROSEBURG (U) — Earl Floyd Wilson, 29, of Oakland, was fatally injured Friday when he was struck by a log that rolled from a truck at the Sunrise Lumber Co. mill at Wilbur.

He died in a hospital here. His wife and two daughters survive.
