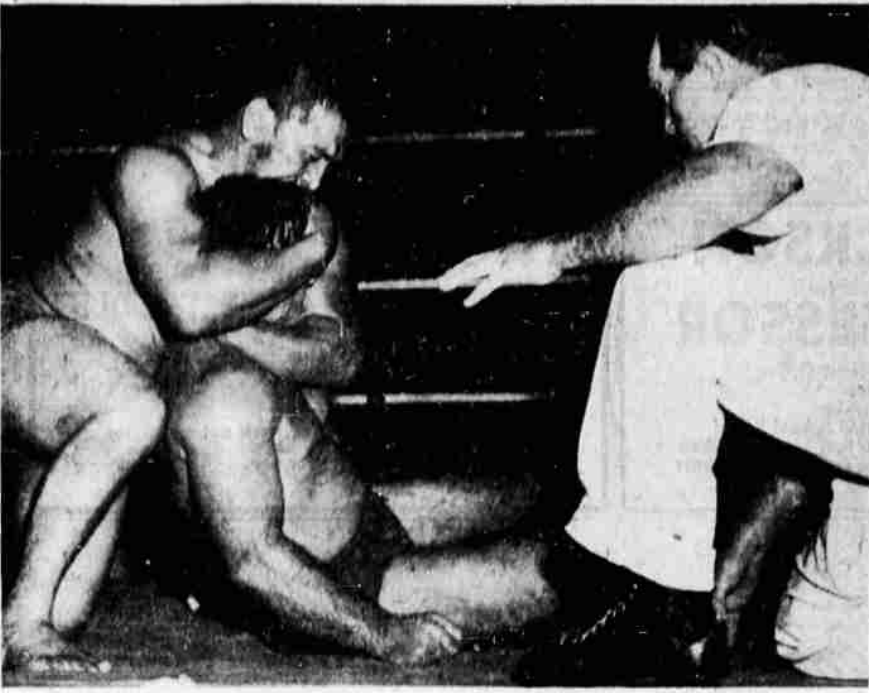

SEATTLE (AP) — Coach Howie Odell planned to send his black and blue Washington Huskies through a light drill Monday as they begin preparing for a fourth straight Pacific Coast Conference grid victory.

The Huskies came out of their 38-14 win over Oregon State at Portland Saturday with an above-par collection of bruises, but right halfback Bill Earley appeared to be the only doubtful starter for next week-end's game here with California.

Earley re-injured a foot when he was hauled down with a jarring tackle after nabbing a pass from Don Heinrich in the OSU game.

LONG IRISH RUN — NOTRE DAME, Ind. (AP) — Halfback Joe Heap's 92-yard touchdown return of a Pittsburgh punt this season was one of the longest punt returns in Notre Dame history. It ranks with such recent accomplishments as Terry Brennan's 96-yard kickoff return against Army in 1947, Bob Livingston's 92-yard gallop from scrimmage against Southern California in 1947 and Larry Coutre's 91-yard dash against Navy in 1949.

Alabama's Crimson Tide football team lost 508 yards on penalties in 1951. Their opponents lost 500 yards.

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Bowl Picture Remains Clouded

NEW YORK (AP) — As the politicians would say, the time has come, ladies and gentlemen, to start looking ahead.

Five football coaches of the country's major teams are doing just that today. They're looking ahead to the remainder of their schedules and hoping they can remain unbeaten and untied, Michigan State, Maryland, Georgia Tech, Southern California and UCLA are the teams still in the select circle.

One thing is certain and that is, barring a tie, either UCLA's Red Sanders or Southern Cal's Jesse Hill is going to be disappointed before the season ends. Their teams meet head on two weeks from Saturday and on the result probably will go the Pacific Coast Conference title and a bid to the Rose Bowl.

NOT TOUGH — Neither has a particularly tough task this week. UCLA meets Oregon State and Southern Cal goes against Stanford, the defending conference champion.

As for Biggie Munn and his Michigan State outfit, the No. 1 team in the weekly Associated Press poll, the Spartans' next three opponents — Indiana, Notre Dame and Marquette — are thinking up ways and means of keeping the score down. Of them all the Irish stand the best chance of getting through unscathed.

NOT EASY — Jim Tatum's Maryland forces face the two toughest foes on their schedule when they get back into action two weeks hence—Mississippi and Alabama.

If Bobby Dodd and his Georgia Tech operatives can get by Alabama on Nov. 15, they should be able to close the season's business with a perfect slate.

In addition to Mississippi, Oklahoma and Villanova still are among the unbeatens although tied.

As for the bowls, the picture still is cloudy and probably will be for at least another week. Georgia Tech is a certainty to go to either the Orange or Sugar Bowl—probably the latter. Michigan State, which operates under Big Ten Rules, is ineligible as is Maryland, which is on a one-year suspension from the Southern Conference for playing in the Sugar Bowl Jan. 1.

HOST TEAM — The Rose Bowl probably will have UCLA or Southern California as the host. The Big Ten representative is far from being determined. Purdue is the current leader. Michigan also has a good chance of making it, despite being upset, 22-13, by Illinois Saturday.

The Southwest Conference champion acts as host in the Cotton Bowl. The best that can be said

is that Texas, on the basis of its 31-14 triumph over Southern Methodist, is in the favorite's role.

FOLLOW SCRIPT — Except for South Carolina's well-turned 21-14 victory over Virginia, most of Saturday's games followed the expected script. Michigan State nipped Purdue, 14-7; Maryland breezed past Boston University, 24-7; Oklahoma shut out Iowa State, 41-0; Georgia Tech defeated Duke, 28-7; Kansas stopped Kansas State, 26-6; UCLA defeated California, 28-7; Tennessee swept past North Carolina, 41-14; Notre Dame halted Navy, 17-6, and Penn State nipped Penn, 14-7.

Jayvees Grab Title In Win Over Ashland

The Klamath Junior Varsity finished its season with a 21-7 victory over the Ashland JV's on the losers field last Saturday.

The win gave the Klamath Junior Varsity the unofficial Southern Oregon Junior Varsity championship. The other win in the district was over Grants Pass two weeks ago. The Klamath boys tied Medford but even with a tie they came out ahead in the race for the title.

Jim Bevans, halfback, scored early in the first quarter when he went around right end on a pitch-out from quarterback Larry Yarnell. Lou Zarosinski kicked the extra point.

Don Dexter scored in the second quarter on what was easily the best run of the game when he intercepted an Ashland pass and ran 82 yards down the left side line for a touchdown. Zarosinski again kicked the conversion.

Richie Taylor, Ashland fullback, accounted for all the Ashland points. Taylor plowed through the center of the Klamath line to score from the KU 1 after doing a large part of the running to set up the

play. Taylor then booted the extra point, cutting the JV's lead to 14-7.

Jim Bevans, Mike Chase and Don Dexter did the majority of the carrying in the fourth quarter to advance the ball to the Ashland two yard stripe. After three attempts to charge through center failed, Don Dexter ran around right end for the last TD of the game. Zarosinski booted the ball through the uprights to gain a perfect record of kicking for the day.
