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West German Citizens Thrive On Free Enterprise; East Side Still Suffers

Without the threat of Communist militarism hanging hard just beyond the storied Iron Curtain West Germany would be a fine place to live, Capt. Ralph Taylor of Klamath Falls thinks.

Home after three years service in that country, Taylor is spending a month here with his mother, Mrs. May Taylor, and with his wife's parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Burton.

Taylor, his wife and three children have been living in Darmstadt, a few miles from the Rhine River between Frankfurt and Heidelberg. The city has a population of 150,000.

While there Taylor was executive officer with the European Command newspaper Stars and Stripes, and later was inspector general with the First Division along the Czechoslovakian border.

"The traffic is heavy along that border," he said, "it's all one-way coming across to the Allied territory."

From those indications the people behind the Iron Curtain aren't too happy.

There are other indications, too. For instance, Mr. and Mrs. Taylor recently went to West Berlin along the Autobahn, the only ground route the Soviets allow the Allies to take. In West Berlin shops were full, people were well-dressed and appeared in good economic condition.

A short spin into the Soviet sector of the ancient German capital showed the exact opposite. No rebuilding has been done since the war ended—unless it was by the government for official use. The shops have lines of people in front of them, and the inflated East Mark at that time was worth one-sixth as much as a Western Mark.

The people of West Berlin, Taylor noted, are the only German citizens who have felt the level of the Russian Boot and then regained freedom through Western control. Quite a slice of U.S. territory, on the other hand, when occupied by Allied troops has since been turned over to Russia when Germany was partitioned for occupation.

The West Berliners know now they owe their freedom to the Allied Air Lift, and are extremely friendly to Americans.

The days of the black market in

West Germany are just about gone. A flood of civilian consumer's goods has been on the market for some time, and there is little room for black market operations. In East Germany, however, tobacco or coffee will buy anything there is offered on sale.

Between the American-British-French borders — unlike between the Western and Iron Curtain countries — there are no barriers whatever. Not even a big quarantine station such as divides Oregon from California.

The popular conception that Germany, though a defeated and conquered country in the last war, is further recovered economically than France is true, Taylor feels.

The German people, he says, are self-disciplined. They follow their leaders and aren't apt to become over-involved in political confusion. The French are the opposite. They eat, sleep and talk politics, and meanwhile accomplish much less in recovering from the plights of recent war.

Thus the Germans are working to rebuild. The French are talking politics.

Taylor says the German border guard—the Grenze Polizei — is a well-armed contingent which is actually the nucleus for what may soon become the German portion of the European Army.

The Klamath Falls man, now 34, is to remain here a month before reporting back to duty at Ford Ord, Calif., with the Sixth Division. He doesn't know yet what job awaits him there, but Capt. Taylor expects he'll stay for from four to six months.
