Spud Ship Pace Lags

Klamath Basin potato shipments are lagging somewhat this season behind the same date a year ago according to figures released today by the Oregon State Department of Agriculture's shipping point inspection service office here.

As of Monday, the figures show, shipments so far this year 1,453 carloads of potatoes have been shipped out of the Klamath area. Same period last year saw 1,619 carloads outbound.

Rail shipments this year total 1,770 cars as compared with 2,171 last year, and trucklot shipments show 317 outbound this year as against 882 last.

Monday alone 47 cars were shipped as against 73 for the same date one year ago.

Farm Labor Need Filled

Farm employment in the Klamath area dropped drastically following the end of potato and grain harvest, the Klamath Falls employment office announced in a bulletin released today.

At the height of the season, the report shows, there were approximately 1,800 transient laborers employed in this area. Most have since moved south for the winter.

A few growers, according to Employment Office, Mar. Guy Barker, were short of help at the peak of the season, but in general the crops harvested without a labor drought.

During the month of October, Barker reported, there were 9,496 visits made to his office as compared with 9,553 the year before. Some 498 applicants were placed non-agriculturally as compared with 343 for October a year ago.

Agricultural placements this October were more than 1,000 above the same month a year ago—3,069 to 2,061.

Washington Concedes

SEATTLE — Democratic Party leaders early Wednesday conceded that Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower had carried Washington.

State Chairman Don Abel closed party headquarters without issuing a statement, but other high Democratic officials, who said they preferred not being named admitted "there is no hope we can overtake the general."

At that time, Eisenhower had 175,643 votes and Stevenson 155,271, with 1,578 of the state's 4,381 precincts reported.

The state voted Democratic in the past five presidential elections. It has nine electoral votes.

Nixon Calls For Unity

LOS ANGELES — Sen. Richard M. Nixon, successful GOP candidate for vice president, urged all Americans early Wednesday to "join together behind the leadership of Gen. Dwight Eisenhower to advance the cause of freedom and to bring about peace throughout the world."

The young running mate of Gen. Eisenhower spoke to a nationwide audience on television and radio shortly after the general made his winning declaration in New York City.

PATROL BOAT SINKS

TOKYO — A U. S. Navy patrol boat collided with a Japanese fishing boat Tuesday and sank after reaching Yokosuka harbor. The newspaper Asahi said the crew of four was safe. The fishing craft was not damaged seriously.

Four 4-H'ers Named For National Camp in June

Oregon's four 4-H representative to the National 4-H club camp in Washington D. C. next June have been announced by Burton Huston, State club leader at Oregon State College.

The four are Marilyn Bradshaw, Albany; Marilyn Bohmert, Central Point; John Belton, Canby; and Bill Gardner, Canyon City.

Along with two girls and two boys from each of the other 47 states, Alaska, Hawaii and Puerto Rico, the Oregon youths will spend a week in citizenship training at the nation's capital next summer.

Delegates are selected for leadership, scholarship and general 4-H achievement on the basis of 4-H records and personal interviews.

Both of the 17-year-old girl winners are enrolled at Oregon State college this fall. Miss Bradshaw, winner of the Bakers 4-H Leadership trophy earlier this year, is registered in home economics. A graduate of Corvallis high school, her specialties are sewing and cooking.

Miss Bohmert, a veteran of eight years club work, has won many honors in livestock competition and is studying agriculture at OSC. A graduate of Crater high school, she showed the grand champion 4-H steer at the state fair in 1950 and this year was named alternate for the sweepstakes scholarship at the San Francisco junior grand national.

Seventeen-year-old Belton is a senior at Canby union high school this year. His major interests in club work are in dairy, sheep and beef projects. Belton also was organizer of a forestry club for younger 4-H'ers in his county.

Gardner, 18, is a graduate of Grant union high school. In 1951, he won the County Leadership trophy and is four-time winner of the scholarship for 4-H summer school awarded annually to the outstanding 4-H boy of the county.
