

Merrill, Jacksonville Mix Saturday

Dist. 5 Crown At Stake

The Merrill Huskies, given the nod yesterday by principals to represent Klamath County in district football play, face Jacksonville Saturday, 2 p.m., on the Merrill turf.

The grid match is a battle between the Class B Dist. 5's two best teams.

Jacksonville, fielding an 11-man football team for the first time— they've graduated from the six-man variety—rules the roost in Jackson county.

5-2 VOTE
Merrill, ending in a tie with Malin for the Klamath County title but boasting a win over the Mustangs.

The Herald and News learned this morning that the Merrill-Jacksonville game had been moved up to Friday, 7:30 p.m., from the scheduled Saturday afternoon date.

Merrill Principal Harold Hendrickson said the change was made to allow more persons to witness the Class B district football clash and because of a conflict of assignments on officials working the game.

The winner of the contest will meet the Dist. 6 winner in the state Class B quarter-finals.

Merrill, under Dean Sheiden, last won the Klamath County football title in 1950, losing 19-34 to Phoenix in district play.

Both teams are once-beaten, Merrill, in both league and non-league games, lost just to Henley, but racked up six victories.

PHOENIX LOSS
Jacksonville lost to Phoenix, proverbial Class B kingpin in Jackson County but now playing A-2 football.

They hold five wins, clinching the title with a 33-6 win over Talent.

Ed Rooney is the Jacksonville coach, steering the Miners to a runner-up spot in the six-man state playoffs last year.

Jacksonville's backfield is sparked by halfback brothers Don and Leroy Clay.

Olszewski Top Rusher

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Johnny Olszewski of California, stopped by UCLA last week, still leads the Coast Conference in rushing yardage, and Don Heinrich of Washington leads the league in total and passing offense.

Olszewski has gained 656 yards in 116 carries for a 5.7 average gain, and shares the scoring lead in the conference at seven touchdowns and 42 points with George Black of Washington.

Heinrich, the nation's leading passer, has completed 106 out of 203 throws for a 52.2 percentage and 1,337 yards. His total offensive yardage is 1,343.

Two UCLA players, Milt Davis and Bill Sits, have intercepted six passes each. Sits has returned them for 153 yards and one touchdown, Davis for 83 yards.

Jimmy Sears of USC is still the leading punt returner, with 23 for 431 yards and three touchdowns to his record.

Leading punters are Desmond Koch, USC, with an average of 44.8 and Sam Baker, Oregon State, 42.3.

Bears Work On Pass Defense

Cage Fixers Put One Loop Out Of Business, Threaten Another

NEW YORK (NEA)—The young men who became involved in college basketball scandals continue to cause a war wherever they go.

The fixers, whose attempt to barge into the American Basketball League put the 24-year-old wheel out of business, had their sights set on the Eastern League the last time I looked.

The ABL suspended operations after two members took a walk like Gromyko when they were refused approval to use the fudgers. Jersey City had intended to play Alex Groza and Ralph Beard, the ex-Kentuckian and Sherman White, Long Island All-American.

INDICTMENT
Elmira had signed another Kentucky great, Bill Spivey, who's under indictment in connection with the scandals.

The remaining five cities—Wilkes-Barre, Scranton and Hazleton in Pennsylvania, and Manchester and Bridgeport in Connecticut—agreed to fold up, and said the circuit couldn't function under the geographic set-up.

So having put one league out of work, the young men who helped sell out the game turned to President Edward Morgan of the Eastern League.

ANY CHANCE?
Is there a chance they may be accepted?

"I don't want to crucify anybody," Morgan confided. "Each case will be settled individually."

The Hazleton, Pa., official made it crystal-clear he leans toward the scandal-tainted players.

The ABL took its cue from the National Basketball Association in barring the four players, a decision of far-reaching importance.

The NBA was the first professional group to outlaw the men.

SMALL WISE
The Eastern League is a small, cage-wise circuit with big-league ambitions. It would be unwise to try to fatten its gates using the fixers as a lure. They do not belong in basketball.

Alex Groza has been hollering for

another chance. After the ABL, he yelled even louder.

Yet when he was starting at Kentucky, he was a ringleader in the business operations with fixers Nick English, Saul Feinberg and Nat Brown.

Groza, Beard and White, who served a year in jail, and Spivey, facing perjury charges in New York have done nothing to rehabilitate themselves. But they have agitated to get right back on the same old stand.

In contrast to the money-mad players found guilty, Floyd Layne, the City College of New York who was also involved, has been working with impoverished youngsters since receiving a suspended sentence. He has quietly and unobtrusively gone about his chores.

Meanwhile, Groza, Beard, White and Spivey go about smashing up basketball leagues, so bent are they to play again. Unquestionably they should be willing to accept the NBA's edict, which rules 'em off the court for life.

Certainly there should be a place for them in society—but not in basketball.

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Passers Top Yardage Figures on Gridiron

NEW YORK (AP) — It takes a pass to join the elite among the top ground-gainers in major college football circles these days—forward pass, that is.

Eight of the nine players who have managed to accumulate more than 1,000 yards this season are primarily forward passers, statistics released by the NCAA Service Bureau showed Wednesday.

Don Heinrich, of Washington, is the total offense leader, with 1,343 yards in seven games. He also leads the passers in practically everything: 203 attempts, 106 completions, 1,337 yards and 12 scoring passes.

IN ORDER
Behind him, in order, come Cincinnati's Gene Rossi, Columbia's Mitch Price, Maryland's Jack Scarbath, Detroit's Ted Marchbroda, Texas A.M.'s Ray Graves, Vanderbilt's Bill Kreitmeyer and San Jose State's Lynn Aplanalp.

As a group, these eight men have gained 80.2 per cent of their yardage by passing.

And ninth is Harvard's Dick Casby, with 1,017 yards of which 665 have been made by rushing.

He's third among the runners, behind Rod Williams, of Hardin-Simmons, and Gene Filipki, of Villanova, but has been in only six games to their seven.

Williams displaced Filipki, atop the rushing standings all season long, by accumulating 301 yards in his last two games for a season total of 728. Filipki has 703.

WORK HORSE
Price, the workhorse among the quarterbacks, has been in 24 of 25 offensive plays in six games to Heinrich's 223 in seven, but doesn't have an extra game to make up because Washington plays ten.

The only aerial department Heinrich doesn't hold first place in is completion average, John Rydalsch, of Utah, has connected with 65 out of 105 for 61.9. Behind the Washington senior in completions are Rossi and Tommy O'Connell, of Illinois, with 61 and Chuck Maloy, of Holy Cross, with 79.

Heinrich and Maloy are also working their way towards the top of the list in career totals. Heinrich now has 304 completions for third place behind Don Klosterman, Loyola (I.L.) who finished with 368 and Kentucky's Balo Parrilli, who had 331. Maloy is ninth in the all-time standings with 257.

In touchdown responsibility, though, Heinrich must share honors with Yale's Ed Maloy, each being credited with 14. Heinrich
