1,500 Cars Spuds Shipped
A total of 1,500 carloads of potatoes were shipped to commercial markets from the Klamath Basin during the month of October, according to figures released today by Ross Aubrey, in charge of shipping point inspection here. This brings the season total as of Nov. 1 to 1,771 cars by truck and rail.
During the month, 1,310 cars were checked out by rail with 21 cars by overland compiled. Some 239 carloads by truck were also checked out.
During that period thirty cars of California seed were exported, the figures show.
October, 1951, saw 2,016 carloads of potatoes shipped out by truck and rail.
Oregon rail shipments totalled 488, California rail shipments total 727, Oregon truck carlots totalled 122, and California carlots by truck 107.
During the month 117 carloads of potatoes were shipped for the Army quartermaster.
