Alaska Flier Survives Ordeal

FAIRBANKS, Alaska—A bush pilot walked out of the Alaska wilderness Wednesday and told a harrowing story of a six-day battle to reach civilization after his plane was forced down in a snowstorm. Joseph Cook's story was one of desperation and frustration—of how he made a last ditch takeoff from a lake he hacked out with a chainsaw, only to run out of gas in flight.

The Alaskan flier, formerly of Madison, Wis., had been sought since he vanished Oct. 30. As many as 20 planes had joined in the search for him in hazardous weather.

Cook said he landed on a sandbar when he lost his way in snow buries a week ago.

He got into the air again, but snow forced him down on a hilltop. His plane was damaged.

For four days he worked with a hatchet to clear a 150-foot strip through brush. Then he made three takeoff attempts. Each time the plane skidded into brush and suffered more damage.

Although the fabric on the plane was badly ripped, he managed to get into the air on the fourth attempt.

Cook said he was in sight of the Yukon river when the plane ran out of gas.

"I thought I could glide to the river but without the engine, the damaged plane dropped like a streamlined rock," he said.

He crashed and was thrown clear.

Although exhausted and bruised, he walked two days and two nights.

After reaching the Yukon river bank across from the village of Tanana, he lay on his back and

fired a pistol.

A villager heard the shots, flew over and picked Cook up. He was greeted by his son, Pfc. Cornelius Cook, who had been given leave from Ladd Air Base to join in the search. Cook's condition was reported as good.

HST Eligible For Pension

WASHINGTON—When President Truman returns to private life Jan. 20 he will be eligible for a government pension of \$90.66 a month. That's all, the White House said Thursday.

The \$90.66 could be drawn by retired Colonel Truman because of his World War I military service and his later service in the Army Reserve.

Qualified reserve officers start drawing a fraction of their active duty pay upon reaching 60.

There is no compensation of any kind that Truman will be entitled to as an ex-president.

A White House spokesman said, "he doesn't even rate free postage." Free postage is granted to widows of presidents.

Members of Congress have a pension plan which was set up in 1948. Truman quit the Senate before it went into effect.

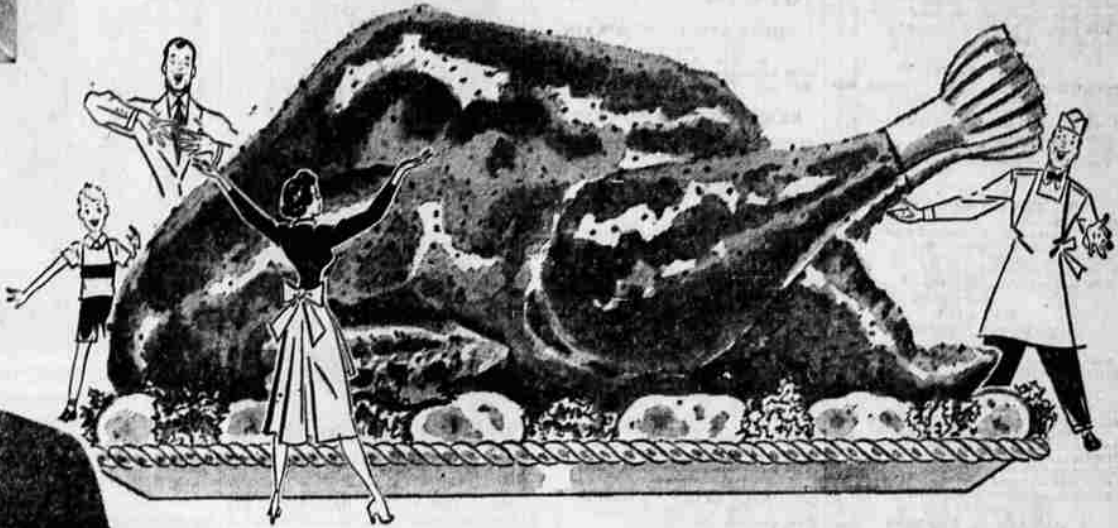
