## New Pastor Coming Here

The Rev. M. Roderick Anderson, who came to Klamath Falls in August, 1951, specifically to develop a new mission of the United Lutheran Church, leaves next week for Portland to develop a church in the Eastmoreland Heights area there.

While here the Rev. Anderson established the Hope Lutheran Church in the Southeast suburban

area. The church has been organized and meeting for about a year now.

Last May he first arrived here, the Rev. Anderson surveyed the proposed area and found an estimated 800 non-church families. The church was established in Shasta School, where services are still being held.

When he first arrived here, the congregation was officially organized with 64 charter members, and shortly afterwards began seeking a permanent pastor.

Their choice was the Rev. John M. Recher, Jr., Sioux City, Ia., who is to become the first official pastor of the church. The Rev. Recher is expected to arrive here in time to preach Sunday, Nov. 16.

The Rev. Anderson's last service will be this next Sunday.

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## Lutherans Believe the Bible is GOD'S WORD

It is not without significance that most statues of Martin Luther show him standing with a Bible in his hand—for it was the rediscovery of the Bible that made the Lutheran Reformation possible.

Once Luther found forgiveness for his sins and peace for his mind in the simple promise of the Scriptures, "The just shall live by his faith," the Bible became the chart and compass of his life.

For more than four centuries the Church which bears the name of Luther has remained faithful to the primary principle of the Reformation, "The Bible alone."

It insists on taking the Bible just as it reads. It refuses to twist the Scriptures to make them conform to human reason. Nor will it agree to add to the Bible "the traditions of the fathers." The Scriptures are sufficient.

To the Lutheran Church the Bible is the only measure of spiritual truth, the only divinely given guide for faith and life.

It is willing to rest its faith on the simple statements of the Bible because it believes the Good Book when it says, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God." It believes the Bible, because it accepts the Bible as God's Word.
