The dancers will play a part in the famous show the Cossacks are bringing to Klamath Falls and the Pelican Theater on their annual tour of the United States. They bring to the Western world the Logzinka, a Caucasian folk dance, and the Kozachok, the dance of the Don Cossacks.

Zina is a native of Northern Caucasus, and Nicholas was born in Samarcand, in Asia.

The couple attended the Academy of Classic Ballet under famous ballet masters and studied the various folk dances—both primitive and national—of some 77 nationalities. Miss Lashkan is the only woman member ever to tour

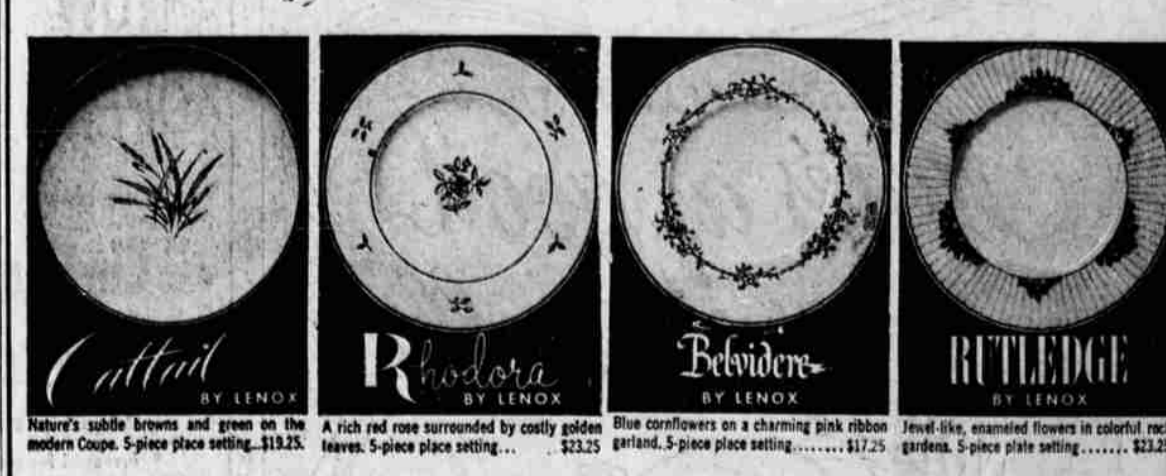
