Hiss To Hear Decision
 LEWISBURG, PA. (AP) — Alger Hiss, serving a five-year prison term here for perjury, may hear within two or three weeks whether he will be paroled.

Hiss becomes eligible for parole on Nov. 21 when he will have completed one-third of his term at the Northeastern Federal Penitentiary.

Dr. George G. Killinger, chairman of the U. S. Parole Board, today began interviews of prisoners applying for parole. He said, however, there was no chance of reaching Hiss' case today.

"I will interview Hiss personally by tomorrow or Friday," Killinger told a newsmen.

Killinger said transcripts of all parole interviews will be sent to Washington for consideration by the full five-member board. To win a parole, the application must be approved by three of the five board members.

Hiss, 47-year-old former State Department official, was convicted of perjury in 1950 on the basis of his sworn testimony that he never gave government secrets to Whittaker Chambers, admitted one-time courier for a Communist spy ring.

Masked Men Warn Yankee
 TUPELO, Miss. (AP) — A 26-year-old newsmen and his pretty blonde wife, under constant police guard, prepared to leave here today a few hours ahead of a 6 p.m. ultimatum set by two hooded men.

Newell Anderson, circulation manager of the Tupelo Journal, decided to return to Fargo in his native North Dakota. He told police the men took him for a wild ride in the country Monday night and roughed him up and that one of the men said he "didn't like Yankees around."

George McLean, publisher of the Journal, said Anderson began getting anonymous telephone calls more than two weeks ago telling him, "we don't like foreigners coming in here and you'd better get out of town."

Anderson and his 21-year-old wife came here Oct. 1 from Grand Forks, N.D., where he had worked on the Grand Forks Herald. They were married there last June.

D. B. Crockett, chief of police in this Northwest Mississippi town of 18,000, said he had some clues but could not disclose them now.

"After he (Anderson) leaves, I think it'll blow over," Crockett said.

Anderson said he was unable to identify the men who roughed him up. He said they wore gauze-like hoods of dark material with no eyeholes. They cut off some of his hair and nicked his face with a razor, the newsmen added.

McLean said the cuts were like deep scratches and that the men also slapped him around.

Mayor G. F. Maynard said that he was puzzled by the incident.

"The young man lives across the street from me and from all reports he is a fine young fellow and came here with good recommendations," Maynard said. "We can't understand why he should be singled out."

"It is not typical of our community and we don't stand for that sort of prejudice."

Broderick Crawford Lists Hollywood's Ugliest Stars

 HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Want to know the 10 unhandomest actors in Hollywood?

They're Broderick Crawford, Spencer Tracy, Jose Ferrer, Humphrey Bogart, Charles Laughton, William Bendis, Paul Douglas, Marlon Brando, James Cagney and Robert Ryan.

Who picked them? Broderick Crawford.

"A frank fellow," says Crawford, "these guys all have ugly masks myself included." He admitted, "I don't mean that we have the kind of a face that would scare children. But we're sure as heck ugly when you compare us to the pretty-boy actor in past screen history."

"And you know something?—I'm glad. The guys with ugly masks are working. And lots of the pretty boys aren't around much any more. I remember one who was hot as a pistol when I came back to pictures from the Army. I see that boy on television now and then."

The whole thing seems to work in cycles. Back in the silent days, the Happers longed for the sleek Latin lovers like Rudolph Valentino, Ramon Novarro and Antonio Moreno. Then came the realism of the depression with mugs like James Cagney, Pat O'Brien and Edward G. Robinson. Even Clark Gable was a departure from the usual handsome leading man.

Then the trend switched back to handsome heartbeats like Tyrone Power and Robert Taylor.

"Now we're back to the mugs again," remarked Crawford. "Pictures are more realistic. The European pictures helped bring that. You see movies from Italy and England and all the actors look like real people."

"I'm not knocking the handsome guys. Lord knows, there's a place for them in this business. Too, I'd look kinda silly trying to play in 'Casablanca.' But I think it's just as silly for Tyrone Power to come down a Western street with both guns blazing or to take on a roomful of gangsters with his bare fists."

For that reason, he suggested a change in his current picture, "Posse." He was supposed to have a knock-down fight with John Derek. Crawford proposed changing the battle to one with Derek's sidekick, played by Charles Bickford.

"John's a good actor, but he probably weighs 160 pounds dripping wet," said Crawford. "I'd look silly fighting him."

AEC Promises H-Bomb Story
 WASHINGTON (AP) — The Atomic Energy Commission says it will have an announcement, apparently soon, in connection with snow balling reports the first American hydrogen bomb has been exploded in the South Pacific.

Vivid eye-witness accounts of a purported "hell" bomb blast—some said it virtually sank an Eniwetok Island—have been received in uncensored letters from U. S. sailors to friends in this country.

An AEC spokesman said yesterday "we will make an announcement" as soon as the current series of atomic tests is concluded. Until then, he said, "we will have absolutely no comment."

Previously, AEC officials had indicated that for security reasons it might be years before anything would be made public about the new bomb.

Descriptions of the recent explosion—H-bomb or super atomic—agree that it was an awesome thing.

One sailor wrote that he watched the spectacle through binoculars from his ship 30 miles away. He saw a great plume of one of the Eniwetok atolls "just seem to melt away" in the fire that burned for six hours after the blast.

Finally, he said, the entire mile-wide atoll "actually disappeared."

Several eye-witness accounts have been published in recent days in Los Angeles, Lima, O., Michigan City, Ind., and Salt Lake City.
