**JOLLY STITCHERS**  
The Jolly Stitchers met at the Tuna -- Beans Appetizing

Inviting in looks and flavor is this tuna casserole. Here green lima beans and tuna are baked to bubbly hotness in a glowingly colorful and savory tomato sauce. The so-smooth sauce is simply contrived of condensed tomato soup and undiluted evaporated milk, plus a modicum of thyme and tarragon for a flavorful lift. The appetizing top for this casserole is coarsely crumbled crackers which toast to crispness and shredded cheese which melts and mingles for mellow contrast.

**SAVORY TUNA AND LIMAS**  
1 10-ounce package frozen lima beans  
1 6 1/2 ounce can tuna  
1 10 1/2 ounce can condensed cream of tomato soup  
1 cup evaporated milk  
1/2 teaspoon dried thyme, crumbled  
1/4 teaspoon dried tarragon, crumbled  
8 salted crackers, coarsely crumbled  
1/2 cup shredded process American cheese  
Cook lima beans according to directions on package. Drain if necessary, then place beans in a lightly buttered 1-quart baking dish. Drain oil from tuna and discard oil. Break tuna into bite size pieces. Empty tomato soup into small mixing bowl. Blend in seasonings and milk. Pour over tuna and beans in baking dish. Sprinkle coarsely crumbled crackers and cheese over top. Bake in moderate oven (350 F.) until mixture is bubbly and cheese and crumbs are lightly browned, about 20 to 25 minutes. Makes 4 servings.

**Bran Muffins Snack Deluxe**

If you had Thanksgiving dinner early in the afternoon everyone is full for quite awhile. But, around nine o'clock someone mentions that he is hungry. Why not serve some Bran Muffins Deluxe. **BRAN MUFFINS DELUXE**  
1/2 cup shortening  
1/2 cup sugar or molasses  
1 egg  
1 cup ready-to-eat bran  
3/4 cup milk  
1 cup sifted flour  
2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
Blend shortening and sugar, or molasses, thoroughly; add egg and beat well. Stir in bran and milk; let stand until most of moisture is taken up, about 5 minutes. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt; add to bran mixture and stir only until combined. Fill greased muffin pans two-thirds full. Bake in moderately hot oven (400 F.) about 25 minutes.  
Yield: 9 medium muffins.
